Prayer: Dependence on God and Communicating with God.





From the desk of the Administrator

I don't know about you, but I am glad to get back to a normal routine. Yes, we have one more day of the Christmas Season, tomorrow's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. However, these days left me rather confused. Maybe it's a sign of age. Lovely!

Perhaps part of the routine is back to the *On Mission for the Church Alive!* Planning Process questions. There are still a few more to go.

How will the Church provide for those LEMs that will lose their jobs? Being part of the Secretariat for Leadership Development and Evangelization, I KNOW this is a great concern. Recently, an audit was done to see the age distribution of our current LEMs. The stats were astounding. If you recall the inverse triangle regarding the Priests – i.e., lots of older Priests on top; few young ones on the bottom – that is the exact same chart for our LEMs! They too are an older population. Come the changes, some may retire, others may not. There will be many more listening sessions regarding LEMs and their jobs before the question can truly be answered.

There are two questions that go together. One is: *Why does All Saints have only three models?* The other, *Why are we not connected to St. Bonaventure?* To both I have to say, you weren't paying attention! Currently we are officially in FIVE models. There has been discussion about THREE additional models. To refresh your memory:

*Model 1 – Us, St. Mary, Glenshaw, St. Joseph, O'Hara, St. Juan Diego, and St. Scholastica.

*Model 4 – Us, St. Aloysius, St. Nicholas, Holy Spirit, and St. Bonaventure.

*Models 12, 44, and 45 – Us, St. Joseph, O'Hara, St. Juan Diego, and St. Scholastica.

The alternates are not yet fully on the table. However, they are two variations of Model 1 and a variation of Model 4. I will keep you up to date on where we are and stand regarding Models.

Another question says *St Mary, St. Joseph, and St. Scholastica all have money and we don't. Do we really have a chance?* As I have said a number of times, don't think about what we DON'T have, think about what we DO have! An excellent Church, a beautiful Activities Building, a handicapped accessible education center, PLUS parking! We have things other's don't. As they say, it ain't over until it's over! Stay tuned.

"We Three Kings" is one of the best known Christmas carols associated with this Sunday's Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. It is unclear if the three visitors to the manger described in the song were actually kings. They are sometimes alternatively described as astrologers or simply "wise men." The focus of "We Three Kings" is not on the three men, but the gifts they brought. The gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh are each described in a verse of the song. Each gift tells us something about Jesus' future life and mission on earth. Gold is the gift of kings, symbolizing Christ's role as king of heaven and earth. Frankincense symbolizes worship of God and prayer. Myrrh was used at the time to embalm dead bodies, and the gift of Myrrh foretold Christ's death on the cross for the salvation of all.
