
**Prayer:** Dependence on God and Communicating with God.

***Manifesting the Spirit***

*The Christmas season closes this Sunday with the Baptism of the Lord. This feast is a sister to last week's feast of the Epiphany. Each of them celebrates an "epiphany," or a manifestation of the Spirit of God in Jesus—first in his birth, and now at his baptism.*

*The divine Spirit is manifested in all of the scriptures for this feast. Psalm 104 highlights the Spirit of God creating and renewing the earth, while the reading from Isaiah describes God restoring Israel. In Luke's account of the baptism of the Lord the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus. And the letter to Titus reminds us that the Holy Spirit was "richly poured out" on us also, through the "bath of rebirth" (Titus 3:5, 6).*

With the feast of the Baptism of the Lord today, we officially end the Christmas season. On

Monday, we begin a rather short period of Ordinary Time that takes us to the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday. Interestingly, the Baptism of the Lord was originally celebrated as part of the Epiphany of the Lord, along with the visit by the magi, and the wedding at Cana. It wasn't until 1955 that Pope Pius XII instituted a separate liturgical commemoration for the Baptism of the Lord, and only in 1969 was it given its current place in the calendar by Pope Paul VI, occurring on the first Sunday after January 6<sup>th</sup>, unless Epiphany is celebrated on January 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup>, in which case the Baptism is celebrated the following Monday. There is a custom started by St. Pope John Paul II that on this feast the Pope baptizes babies in the Sistine Chapel.

A correction to my article in the 12/27 bulletin: The Octave of Christmas concludes with the solemnity of Mary, Mother of God (1/1), not Holy Family (12/27) as was incorrectly stated. My apologies for the error!


**Courtney Busha** has been named to the Deans List at La Roche College for the 2015 Fall semester. Congratulations to Courtney on this academic achievement.
