This is showcased in our four core values, namely:


Prayer: Dependence on God and Communicating with God.

Jubilee Year of Mercy

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mary, whom Catholic tradition names

"Mother of Mercy," at Cana intercedes with her Son to show mercy toward the bridal couple: "Son, they have no wine." But he does more! Jesus' transformation of water into wine is a "sign" (John's term for "miracle") that God's marriage with the whole human race has begun in Jesus' person and ministry, a marriage that will be consummated on the cross: "It is finished"—we are saved! But before Jesus acts, Mary instructs the servers to prepare the way for Jesus' miracle of mercy: "Do whatever he tells you." During this Jubilee Year of Mercy, Mother Church, like Mother Mary, instructs us to share the Spirit's manifold gifts—some of which Paul lists in today's second reading—in generous service to the human family. Thus we prepare the way for Jesus' new miracles of mercy, transforming life's sometimes stagnant water into the refreshing wine of God's mercy.

**Surprises**

Life is full of surprises, some pleasant, some not. The scriptures are filled with stories of God's surprises cropping up when they are least expected: younger children obtaining the inheritance; the lowliest being seated highest up; an itinerant preacher, killed like a criminal, exalted to eternal, heavenly glory.

Anybody who has planned a wedding or similar event knows that they are filled with opportunities for surprises. For the bridegroom in today's Gospel story, who has no direct contact with Jesus, the pleasant surprise came because somebody else paid attention and had faith in Jesus.

We may think that the point of today's familiar story of the wedding at Cana is that when we have faith in Jesus, our lives will be pleasantly changed. A Christian, however, needs to have a broader perspective and realize that to have faith in Christ means that somebody's life—not necessarily our own—will be surprised for the better.

These are the days of special collections! This weekend we do so for St. Anthony and DePaul Institute. The monies collected help to fulfill our Parish Share. So thanks for your generosity! As you might recall, one of the goals of our Pastoral Plan for this year is to study Reconciliation. Next weekend we will take an opportunity to do so. Perhaps it is fitting that our Second Graders will be participating in Reconciliation for the first time on the 23rd. Pray for them as they approach this great sacrament of healing.

Another goal was the self-study by parish organizations. To date, the Men's Club is finished. The others are in process. Therefore, let me share with you what they have done:

Men's Club Envisioning Process

The purpose of the Men's Club is multifaceted. They are an organization open to all men of the parish (even non-Catholic husbands) over the age of 18. They are the "laborers" of the parish, doing the "heavy lifting," if you will. They are often responsible for set-up and clean-up at events. They oversee construction of the parish festival. They sponsor social events like the Night at the Races and the six coffee and donut socials per year. The Men's Club offers a forum for camaraderie for the men of the parish. Their goal is to help Father where they can.

When asked to do five additional activities this year, they selected the following: 1. They would again underwrite Lenten literature. It is a pamphlet of prayers from the Saints that can accompany parishioners during Lent. 2. They asked that one member from each organization be represented on the Parish Pastoral Council. 3. That they would sponsor a bus to take men to a Pirate game. 4. That they would sponsor a five week open gym night. 5. That they would work with the other organizations to have a Parish Picnic in the fall.

Any men interested in joining the Men's Club are welcome to attend meetings held on the first Monday of the month.


