**Liberation and Reform**

*While you might have to reach for an atlas to determine that Isaiah is speaking about Galilee, today's first reading (part of which was read at Christmas) is prophetic of Jesus' future ministry in that province. The light that brings salvation and rejoicing is, ultimately, Christ. Liberation is the theme: liberation from both ignorance ("darkness") and sin (the "yoke").*

*As Isaiah identifies a place, so Paul describes an attitude: the attitude that develops, even among good people, of equating their own will with the common good. This always brings dissension, and so it has done in Corinth. Paul will not allow this; we are all members of "Christ's party." The gospel is not to divide us.*

*Matthew quotes from Isaiah in today's Gospel, presenting Jesus as the fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecies. The theme is "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (Matthew 4:17). To spread this message, Jesus begins to select disciples, four of whom we meet today: Peter, Andrew, James, and John.*

**From the Desk of the Administrator**

Welcome to meeting week! It's been a crazy week of them. Let me share some insight.

Last Sunday I met with the Parish Pastoral and Finance Councils as well as the Parish On Mission Team. Our goal was to look at the eight models for the *On Mission For the Church Alive!* Planning Process. We used a method I learned from the US Congress-the one minute speech. You have but 60 seconds to get your point across. It works really well. Our purpose was to raise to the top what models we think are better suited for the community. We decided that there will be two future meetings to offer the full vision of the models to you all. So, stay tuned.

And if one On Mission meeting is fun, why not have a second? This past Wednesday I was to participate in the "Cross District Meeting". This was for parishes that have models involving places not in their Vicariate or District. This means like St. Bonaventure, St. Mary, the Millvale parishes, not crazy places which you were probably thinking. It was scheduled to last THREE HOURS! Yoi! And double yoi!

This past Thursday brought a day long meeting of the Secretariat for Leadership Development and Evangelization. Nothing like an EIGHT HOUR meeting to enliven your day! It was to be based on the instruments that assist leaders in understanding who they are and what their strengths and weaknesses are. They all have acronyms like APEST, MCore, and DISC. The only normal name is "Strength Finders". I've done the DISC previously when I participated in "Good Leaders, Good Shepherds". These will also be used when I participate in the Priest Leadership and Evangelization Collaborative that begins next week. I think some of these instruments will be helpful when we begin the School of Ministry and Liturgy as proposed in the Capital Campaign.

Friday was the day of the staff meeting. That was the easiest of all of them. Part of it is always trying to understand coming events and how prepared we are for them to take place. It was to begin moving into the concepts of these leadership instruments.

Of course there were other meetings: wedding appointments, funerals, and the like. Just another quiet week in the life of a Priest! Though I'm pretty sure Jesus had less meetings to do what He did. I think I need to learn something from Him!

See you in Church! No meeting required!

**BOX**

Psalm 27 is the source of our responsorial psalm this Sunday. It is an expression of trust in the Lord, who is our light and our

salvation. It also makes many references to the temple, the place where one would most directly encounter the Lord. The psalmist expresses a singular desire to “dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life.” The psalmist also states the belief that he will “see the bounty of the Lord in the land of the living.” The expression “the land of the living” here describes the temple in Jerusalem, where people encountered the life-giving presence of God. Like the psalmist, we too can encounter the life-giving presence of God in the Church. It is even better for us in that we have the Eucharist – the true physical presence of God – in every tabernacle throughout the world! May we find the Lord, our light and our salvation, in the Church and especially in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist.
