And now for something completely different. Consider this your warning! Read on if you dare!

This past Friday a sad anniversary was marked. It was 43 years since the legalization of abortion in our country. The millions of lives lost through abortion is shameful. We should be embarrassed.

However, there is more to the pro-life movement than just the sadness of abortion. Let's consider what it really means to be pro-life.

Infancy. Yes the loss of life not yet begun is sad. Yet what about the children who are born addicted to drugs? What about the children in our own midst who lack adequate care – little or no food, no shelter, no healthcare, no parents?

Adolescence. Ours is a crazy world. What about teens who experiment with drugs or sex? The internet is both the blessing and the curse. Sure it's filled with information, yet what kind? Among the bytes are pornography, links to ISIS, and a host of other things we really don't want to mention. And then too there is bullying both online and in person.

Adults. The American economy is struggling. People are underemployed or over worked. Sometimes they too lack the ability to have adequate care like mentioned previously. What about all the senseless violence seen in our world today? Sometimes I don't even want to watch the news or read the paper.

Elderly. All we have to do is look around ourselves. There's a lot of gray hair and no hair! We are an aging society. What kind of care is extended to the elderly? Health issues cause high insurance rates and related costs of medications. And what about nursing care? Those costs are astonishing. Sadly some people are "thrown away" when placed in a nursing home or skilled care facility to purposefully be forgotten by family. Others find themselves the victims of euthanasia.

Yes, a sad anniversary was marked. However, there is greater sadness all around us.

I ask you to find a person who can help change all this. You need not look far. All you need to do is look into the mirror!

World Marriage Day Mass


