**Prayer:** Dependence on God and Communicating with God.


**Ministry:** Having knowledge of the faith and putting it into practice.

### The Chosen Remnant

Zephaniah is one of the least-known of the Old Testament prophets. He speaks in today's first reading of impending judgment. But the Lord will leave a "remnant" in Israel. This image of a remnant, or remainder, was to become vital to both Judaism and Christianity.

Paul's letter to Corinth makes obvious his deep concern for the Christians there. They are too self-confident, he says, too sure of themselves. He admonishes them to remember that Christ has given them all they have.

Today's Gospel comprises the opening of Jesus' "Great Sermon." As God gave Moses the law on Sinai, so now Jesus gathers his disciples on a hillside to teach them the new law. Each of these Beatitudes contrasts the humiliation of the present with the glory of the future: poverty vs. the riches of God's kingdom, hunger for holiness vs. fulfillment in the Spirit, persecution vs. the reign of God. Jesus is here speaking to God's chosen "remnant."

### From the desk of the Administrator

For the second time since I've been here I received a very depressing phone call. This one was last Saturday evening. A concerned neighbor had phoned to tell me a group of young people, girls this time, were urinating on our Church's shrubs and on the steps! Really? Really! What have we done wrong in raising our youth? What are we going to do about it? I thought Jesus had saved us and brought us new life? It sure seems like evil is winning. We MUST get to work on this TODAY!!! We have no choice in this battle.

Now, among this bad news is some good news. Perhaps over the last couple of weeks you have seen some construction vehicles and workers on the property. Thanks to our insurance coverage, minus our deductible, we have been able to repair the water damage in the Church and in the rectory. At least there are SOME signs of respect for what we have and do around here.

This past week also brought my participation in the first ever Priest Leadership and Evangelization Collaborative. As I mentioned previously, it's about helping us Priests to prepare to be better leaders for the coming changes in our parish structures. Some of the work will involve what I have already done for the Secretariat for Leadership Development and Evangelization.

All these leadership instruments (APEST, MCORE, DISC, and Strength Finders) have been used in various ways in the business world. The purpose is to understand oneself better to be able to lead others better.

So let's talk about my DISC. I naturally exhibit the behaviors of an "S" and "C" – which speaks to behavioral characteristics of "service to others" and "process ability", respectively. Honestly, I do enjoy serving others. However, I do tend to forget about serving myself. I am also able to see processes and chart a path to follow. I think most see that in what I do as director for Liturgy and Worship. My fault here, especially at the parish level, is having the process in mind, but not enough follow through to bring it to completion. Some examples are working with all our liturgical ministers or bringing parts of the pastoral plan to fruition. I need to be counterbalanced by those exhibiting "D" and "I" characteristics – which are about the "directing/domineering" and "human touch/total compassion for people" respectively. Interesting, isn't it?

**World Day for Consecrated Life**




