Prayer: Dependence on God and Communicating with God.

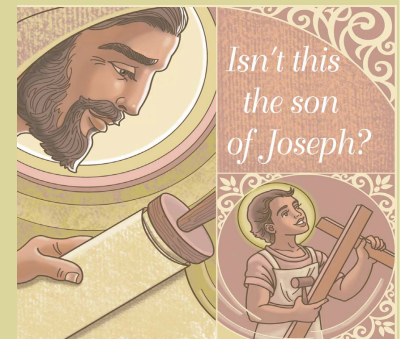

There are three thoughts to bring to your attention this weekend. They are as follows.

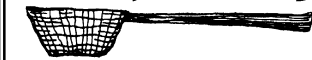

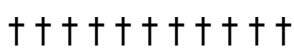
Jesus asks us to follow him, but he doesn't promise that it will always be easy. Jesus himself, in today's Gospel, faced so much hostility towards his message that the crowd attempted to throw him off a steep hillside! More remarkable still is the fact that he was speaking to a hometown crowd, many of whom he presumably would have known personally! This is juxtaposed with the well-known second reading from First Corinthians, the Apostle Paul's writing on the nature of love, commonly read at weddings. What we can take away from these seemingly conflicting readings is that if we love each other in the way Paul describes we will all have an easier time following Jesus. There is more than enough hostility in our world, so we should all try to live the advice given in the title of this weekend's offertory hymn - "Christians, Let us Love One Another"!

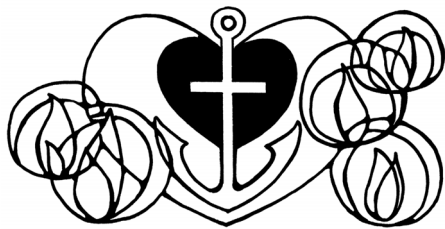
