Prayer: Dependence on God and Communicating with God.



DO YOU REMEMBER YOUR BAPTISM? From its earliest days, the Church has seen Lent as a time to remember our baptism. On that day each of us became a member of the **Body of Christ**. St Paul reminds

us that in baptism we share a common bond with all other Christians. In 1 Corinthians 12:12-13, 25 he writes, "As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit...there should be no division in the body but... its parts should have equal concern for each other." The 40 days of Lent are a time to **remember our baptism** and consider the meaning of our lives and how together we can better follow Jesus as members of His Body.

This Lent, as we continue to journey *On Mission for The Church Alive!* all Catholics are invited to "**Back to the Font**," a Morning of Reflection that includes presentation, prayer and discussion. From the desk of the Administrator

As I mentioned previously, I am participating in the Priest Leadership and Evangelization Collaborative. It is an opportunity for us Priests to learn about ourselves to be better equipped to lead parishes when the On Mission Planning Process is completed.

There were a couple of insights that I discovered in the time together. Let me share with you.

The first day ended with a video for our reflection. The video was of the scientific metamorphosis of a caterpillar to a butterfly. So, when the caterpillar enters into the chrysalis an amazing transformation begins. The caterpillar breaks down all its cells. It then begins to reorganize them into new cells. So, in comparison, very little DNA of the caterpillar can be found in the butterfly! I had NO CLUE about that process or if I did, it was long forgotten. I would have to say my brothers and I were really wrapped up in the video.

The point of the video was to help the Priests realize that there will be incredible transformation through the On Mission Planning Process. Perhaps very little of what we currently "know" or experience in terms of parish life will be the same. There will be a new creation and a new way of living.

Perhaps in some way, it's what I have been saying to all of you all along. I have been putting it into the context of our theology of the Paschal Mystery. Recall that it is about passion, death, resurrection and new life. There will be suffering, there will be a "death" of what we know. Yet, there is resurrection and new life, something better awaiting us. Let's keep that in mind.

The second day brought the purpose of the collaborative, meeting in smaller groups. There were about a dozen of us together. I learned A LOT in that small group.



In that smaller group, I learned that my brother Priests currently struggle with the passion part, no different than all of you. There was A LOT of concern about the point of the planning process, what the end of the process would bring, and what we will be losing through the process.

If they felt that way, how did I feel? I am concerned. I wonder about what this future will be. Yet, I have to go back to theology. As a man of faith, I have faith and trust in Jesus Christ. I believe in His Paschal Mystery. It won't be easy, but we will make it through.

The Lord tells us in the Gospel today that we are the light of the world, and that we must not hide that light but let it shine before others in our good deeds. The Psalm response describes a person who acts with justice as a “light in darkness to the upright.” This individual is described further in the Psalm as someone who is gracious and lends, trusts in the Lord, and gives lavishly to the poor. The first reading from Isaiah goes into more detail on how we can be the light of the world. To be light for the world as envisioned by Isaiah, we must share our food with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and homeless, and provide clothing for those who have none. We must strive to accomplish all of this not only as individuals, but as the Church, and as a broader society. These are the things we are called by Christ to do if we are sincere when we sing the words of our recessional hymn: “We are the light of the world, may our light shine before all, that they may see the good that we do and give glory to God.”

Kindergarten Registration




