
Sacraments

"THE INNOCENTS"**A Pro-Life Artwork by Nikki Bruni**

This acrylic on canvas is an original rendition of French artist William Borguereau's "L'Innocence" and will enhance our sanctuary on Wednesday, February 24th for a week. Within the larger image of Mary, Jesus and the Lamb, there are 2,366 tiny faces, representing the lives ended by abortion at Pittsburgh's Planned Parenthood in 2013. The 14 gold squares represent the lives saved during pro-life witnessing at that same clinic. The artist chose this image for her pro-life rendering because of the powerful way in which Jesus is depicted as the sacrificial victim, while still an infant. The purpose of this artwork is two-fold: **First, it is to memorialize each human life by giving them a name. Secondly, this work is meant to help us to recognize the tragedy of abortion, to realize what it has cost us, and to serve as an opportunity to grieve and to repent. Ladies of Charity (LOC) Envisioning Process

The LOC exists to serve the poor, needy, sick, and elderly. They are to follow the examples of St. Vincent de Paul, St. Louise de Marillac, and St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, by serving with simplicity, humility, and charity without prejudice, in imitation of Christ. They are also tasked with praying for the dead. They want to be the face of Christ to the world through their good works.

As one of their good works, some members recently went to the Ronald McDonald House to cook a meal for the residents.



When asked to do five additional activities this year, they selected the following:

1. Add to the bereavement ministry
2. Identify and connect with critically ill and homebound
3. Establish a schedule to serve critically ill and homebound
4. Use the parish census to identify people in need of help and assistance
5. Partner with the Men's Club to sponsor one activity for the youth of the community

The LOC is open to all women of the parish. There is a process of discernment for being invested as a Lady of Charity. They usually meet on the last Saturday of the month.

Over the coming weeks, we will be singing the “Hymn for the Holy Year of Mercy”, which is a special hymn composed by Paul

Inwood for Pope Francis' Holy Year of Mercy this year. You have already heard it sung by our choir if you attended our Ash Wednesday evening Mass. The antiphon, written in Latin, is *Misericordes sicut Pater!* ([Make us] Merciful like the Father!). Each of the four verses is a litany of four examples of God's mercy sung in English by the cantor/choir, followed each time with a response by the congregation in Latin: *in aeternum misericordia eius* (his mercy is everlasting). The Latin antiphon is pronounced phonetically **mee-say-ree-cor-days see-koot pah-tair**, and the response used within the verses is pronounced **een ay-tair-noom mee-say-ree-cor-dee-ah ay-yoos**. Although the Latin will be challenging initially, hopefully singing this hymn will bring us closer to the Church's celebration of Mercy in this Holy Year!

Festival 2016 Meeting


