Today's Readings

First Reading — The LORD said to Abram: All the families of the earth shall find blessing in you (Genesis 12:1-4a)

From the Desk of the Administrator

The theme of the Colloquium that I recently attended was "Music as Mystagogy". The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, the RCIA, was the path to help us along. I found it quite challenging. It may be to you as well.

Music as Evangelization. There is an urgency to evangelization. We have to help people hear the story, the Good News. Does music evangelize? It can. How it does so is mysterious. There is something about the text that evangelizes. There is something about the style of music that evangelizes. Music speaks to different people in different ways. There is also something about the presentation – dare I say performance? – or the embodiment of music, be it by the presider, cantor, or congregation. Music evangelizes a person mysteriously.

Music as Catechesis. How does music teach? Rooted in oral instruction in a community of faith, music teaches in its own way. So, look to a hymn's text. What does it say as just text? What about the hymn tune? How does that change the text? Does a different tune change what you hear? We can learn in a new way through music.

Music as Sacrament. Sacraments define literally as a commitment to future action. They also truly embody the connection between Divine and human realities. The future action is to deepen our relationship with God and God's grace. Music can explicate and deepen that relationship. So, we shouldn't just slap on sacraments; musicians can help people grow in and deepen their relationship with God through music.

Music as Mystagogy. Mystagogy is about being guided into the mystery. We do this in liturgy itself and/or through a guide, be it homiletic or teaching. Yet, in plumbing the depths, we desire an excess, we desire to know and "have" more. It is through words, ritual actions, art, and music that we can come to understand how we are to live from the mystery that is the liturgy. Music can and should be our guide into the mystery.

Conclusion. While evangelization, catechesis, sacrament, and mystagogy guide us along, as ministers, we are also called to be the mystagog, the guide for others. Maybe we need to ask ourselves, as well as those around us, "What was is that we just did?" We all need to unpack the liturgy to really understand and appreciate what is happening there.

When people first encounter the Lord, they often do not understand or know how to respond. In today's Gospel, Peter, James, and John witness Jesus being transfigured on the mountain. They see Jesus' face shine as bright as the sun, and his clothes white as light. They are afraid and confused. Peter does recognize that "it is good that we are here." When we first begin our journey with Christ, we are much like the three disciples. We are overwhelmed and confused, but we know that it is good that we have encountered him. The catechumens who will be initiated this Easter are going through this process now. Once we realize that it is good to be in the presence of the Lord, then we can begin to hear his voice. We can then ask the Lord, as we sing in the words of our psalm response today, "Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you."


