Prayer: Dependence on God and Communicating with God.


Ministry: Having knowledge of the faith and putting it into practice.

From the desk of the Administrator

First a word of thanks to those who attended Mandated Reporter Training the other week. It was about a quarter of our volunteers. I appreciate you giving up a Saturday morning for it.

I know that others need that as well as some additional training. I know that some of you need to complete the database application as well as completing the Protecting God's Children training. We can schedule an in-house PGC in the not too distant future. Stay tuned for this and more!

A couple weeks back I mentioned the combined Vicariate Meeting. While still bound to confidentiality, I can say a few things about the meeting.

First, the auditorium was packed! I saw Priests and Deacons who I haven't seen in forever! Of course, there was a mandatory tag to the meeting, but still...

Second, while I can't comment on the specific groupings, I can say I was struck by the 2025 clergy distribution. I knew the number of Priests was declining, but, sheesh! Some very large territories will have only one or two Priests in the Future. That was scary! So, pray for vocations and encourage men you know to think about Priesthood.

Third, there were some thoughts about going forward. I feel comfortable sharing those with you. They include the following:

- Bishop has asked parishes to have a time of Eucharistic Adoration between April 27 and October 14. Ours will be August 3, 2018. While that is our normal First Friday, it also coincides with the 116th Anniversary of our founding. Come and pray for the Church that day!

- Parishes will continue business as usual through October 14th.

- *Our Campaign for the Church Alive!* has about two years left for the last group's redemption. The new clergy team will be given all the case statements to reprioritize the use of the funds.

- Of great concern are the Lay Ecclesial Ministers – the paid professionals in Church ministry. Their anxiety over job security is high. Resources will be made available to guide any transitioning necessary.

- Lots of dates were raised: 23-25 April, Bishop will meet with the new clergy teams for 20 minutes to give assignments. On April 26th, all the clergy will learn everyone's assignments. On April 28th, all parishes will hear their grouping and clergy assignments. At the same time, Bishop will have a press conference to give the global




Next Sunday, Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord or Palm Sunday, marks the beginning of Holy Week, the most important and holy season of the liturgical year. Palm Sunday begins with the Commemoration of the Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem, where we get to join with the crowds who welcomed Jesus as he entered Jerusalem on his way to Calvary, singing "Hosanna!" and waving palm branches. Our attention then quickly turns to the Passion of the Lord as we hear the Passion Gospel narrative, this year from Mark's Gospel.
