Children of the Light

The future king, David, in today's first reading, is an example of a type of character present throughout the Hebrew scriptures. He is the child born out of place (not the eldest or most favored) who ends up receiving the promise of the covenant. The spirit of God's anointing rushes upon him. In this way, he is similar to the man born blind from today's Gospel. David's family and the blind man's community did not expect the miraculous grace of God's love to work through them. Perhaps they, too, were "blinded" by the expectations and assumptions of those around them. Yet, after being touched by God, they both came to "see" the presence of God's will for them. Both became messengers of God's will. That same Spirit of God's anointing rushed upon us at our baptism; we were given a candle as a sign of our membership in the Body of Christ, the Light from Light. Our vocation, then, is to fulfill that enlightenment, that anointing, as Ephesians tells us, by living as "children of the light."



JESUS HEALED THE BLIND MAN

in today's Gospel. **On Mission for the Church Alive!** calls us to see in a new way what it means to be in relationship with each other as the Church. We are

called to expand those relationships beyond what we have known and been comfortable with in our own parishes. It won't be easy, so let's pray this week that Jesus will heal and strengthen us for the changes that lie ahead. Learn more and sign up for email updates at OnMissionChurchAlive.org.



Today's familiar Gospel reading of the man born blind who is then healed of his blindness by Christ reminds us that we are all, in a

sense, born blind. It is not our physical eyes that are blinded, but the eyes of our heart as a result of original sin. The water of baptism washes away the "blindness" of original sin, that allows us to see clearly the light of Christ that we can follow him. It is hard to follow what you cannot see, as anyone who has had to follow someone by car in rain, snow, or fog would certainly know! This Gospel reading brings to mind two hymns that express this sentiment exactly. One is Jesse Manibusan's "Open My Eyes", which speaks not only of asking the Lord to open our eyes and ears to see and hear him, but has a bridge which talks about seeing God's face "in places we've never known." Following the Lord will lead you to find him in places and people you least expect! The other hymn is the well known and loved "Amazing Grace": *I once was lost, but now am found; was blind, but now I see!* The ability to seek and find Christ gives direction and purpose to our lives.


This Sunday is also Laetare Sunday (the Latin word *laetare* means "rejoice"). This is taken from the Entrance Antiphon assigned to the 4th Sunday of Lent, which begins "Rejoice, Jerusalem." Laetare Sunday takes on a more joyful character than the other Sundays of Lent, and the liturgical color is pink instead of the usual deep purple of Lent. Let this Sunday serve as a reminder that while Lent is a penitential season in which we reflect on our sin and strengthen our resolve to fulfill our baptismal promises, there is always reason to be joyful as followers of Christ who are promised eternal life through Christ's death and resurrection!
