**Prayer:** Dependence on God and Communicating with God.

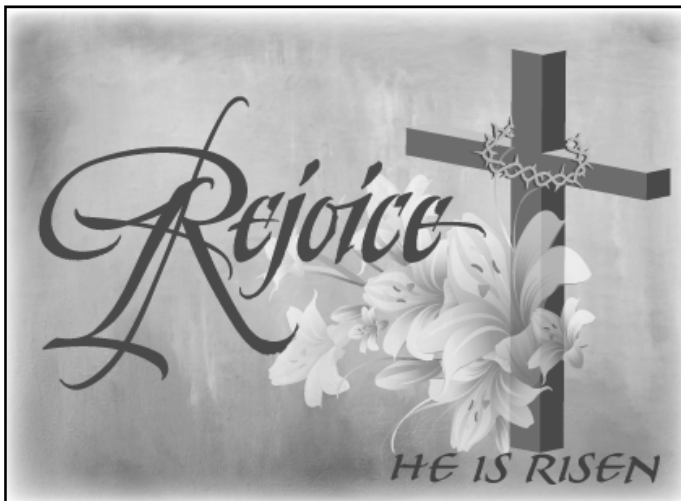
**Ministry:** Having knowledge of the faith and putting it into practice.

 “Christ is risen from the dead! Come let us follow in His footsteps.” When Easter comes, I can’t help but think of these two sentences. It was the entire Easter homily delivered by a priest friend of St. John Paul II. Of course, the late



Holy Father chided his friend that perhaps more could be said. However, I agree with the Priest! I think those two sentences say it all! So now that Christ is risen, let us follow Him even closer! Happy Easter to all!

Without a doubt, Easter can’t come without some preparation. The Lenten season has helped us prepare spiritually. There have been those “saints” among us who have helped to make our church building beautiful for this day. There have been other “saints” who have worked extra hard in their liturgical ministries, especially over the days of the Triduum. There are still other “saints” who came and prayed throughout Lent (coming to 40 minutes with Jesus and the Stations of the Cross) as well as during these last days. Thanks to you all!

Our celebration of Easter comes in the midst of the Jubilee Year of Mercy. I remind you of one of the spiritual works of mercy: pray for the living and the dead. **BOX**

Jesus Christ is risen today!  
 Alleluia! Today, we finally arrive at Easter, ending our long journey through Lent and Holy Week.

Easter begins with the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday in a four part liturgy celebrating Christ as the light of the world, recounting the history of salvation from Abraham to Christ, blessing the waters of baptism and reaffirming our baptismal promises, and finally sharing in the Eucharist. Masses for Easter Sunday include a sprinkling rite with the water blessed at the vigil, and the same reaffirmation of baptismal promises in place of the usual Creed. There is also a Sequence (an ancient hymn) that is sung prior to the Alleluia on Easter Sunday. The celebration of the Easter solemnity continues throughout the week, known as the Octave, which will end with Divine Mercy Sunday. Each day of the Octave is treated as a solemnity with the Creed and Gloria being sung or said as we usually do for Sunday Masses.

A very happy and blessed Easter to you and your families from the All Saints Choir and Music Ministry! May the risen Lord bless you and bring joy to your hearts this Easter season!

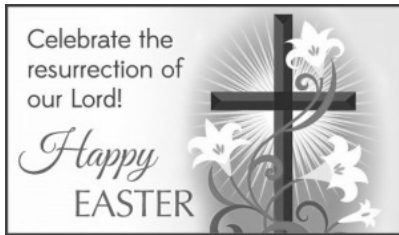
**“New Life in the Spirit Seminar “ Series**
