From the Desk of the Administrator

Last week I had mentioned the Priest Leadership and Evangelization Collaborative was taking place. Through it, and my work in the Secretariat, I have been learning more about leadership.

I've been learning how leadership involves knowing one's self before being able to lead others. I have shared with you the instruments we are using – APEST, DISC, MCORE, and Strength Finders. While I am still being coached on these I think I can say something about them.

What is APEST? Well, it's not being "a pest"! It comes from the five-fold ministry in St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, Chapter 4. There he talks about the need for Apostles, Prophets, Evangelists, Shepherds, and Teachers. I scored high in Teaching and Prophetic. "The genius of Teaching leadership is their ability to reveal and communicate the wisdom of God." The Prophetic leader "is a questioner, freely [questioning] the status quo and challenging individuals and organization to move in a different direction."

I've not yet been coached on the MCORE. As the report says, "This is what moves you. This is what makes you tick-what gets you out of bed in the morning. Based on your stories of success, we've mapped out your motivational blueprint so you can gain new insight into why you do what you do, and how you can leverage your motivations to deepen your sense of meaning, joy, and productivity in your work. My three core motivations are: Advance, Overcome, and Bring to Completion. More to come on this one!

So let's talk about my DISC, which I have mentioned previously. I naturally exhibit the behaviors of an "S" and "C" – which speaks to behavioral characteristics of "service to others" and "process ability", respectively.

Strength Finders "is based on Gallop's 40-year study of human strengths, [creating] a language of the 34 most common talents ... to help people discover and describe these talents." The idea is to use your strengths and to give up trying to fix your weaknesses. My five greatest strengths include the following: Context (understanding the present through the past), Consistency (treating people the same via clear rules), Empathy (sensing the feelings of others), Responsibility (taking ownership of what I say I will do), and Analytical (seeking reasons and causes that might affect a situation).

BOX

The liturgy for this Fifth Sunday of Lent in many ways is reminiscent of the funeral liturgy. Both the First Reading from

Ezekiel ("I will open your graves and have you rise from them") and the Gospel Reading from John about the raising of Lazarus are read at many funeral Masses. We get a very vivid reminder today about the reality of natural death, but ultimately the real hope of resurrection and eternal life promised by Christ to those who believe. There are, of course, many great hymns which are inspired by this Gospel passage from John, but "I am the Bread of Life" by Sister Suzanne Toolan is particularly well known and beloved. In its first four verses, it quotes the important and powerful statements Christ makes about the nature of himself in relation to resurrection and eternal life. The fifth and final verse then quotes Martha's response to Christ: "Yes, Lord, I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, who has come into the world." It is this response by Martha that should be our own response as well. Yes, Lord, I believe!
