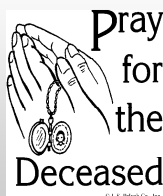

**From the Desk of the Administrator**

During some recent homilies, I talked about my other hat as director of the Department for Worship. I need to add some more comments about what I am doing over there.

There is a new translation of the *Order of Celebrating Matrimony* coming. While promulgated in Latin in 1991, only now is it coming to English. Guess who gets to help to prepare the Diocese for its implementation? You get only ONE guess! I foresee many workshops in my future! Good thing I enjoy teaching.

With the introduction of this new translation, I think it provides a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the celebration and the preparation for marriage. Let me share some thoughts with you on these two topics.

What is to happen at a marriage celebration? Simply, a man and a woman are to stand before God, the Church's authorized minister, and two witnesses to profess their permanent love for each other. It seems simple enough. However, thanks to the "Big Three" (the bridal industry, Hollywood, and societal pressures) it is not. Marriage is a sacrament – an outward sign instituted by Christ to give God's grace. Many "traditions" are associated with ceremonies. Sadly, these "traditions" are either medieval trappings that are an insult to the bride or designed by the "Big Three". We have to work against that pressure.

Now, how should a couple be prepared for marriage? From what I've been reading, it's about companioning with the couple to help them grow in discipleship. The model comes from the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. There is a time of inquiry, then immediate preparation, then the celebration of the sacrament, and finally reflection/guidance over the first years of marriage. I have begun some "experiments" with three couples in this regard who are looking to marry in 2017. Pray for them and me!
