PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN

Training Adults to Protect Children.....

Maximizing a church's role as a child-safe environment begins with making adults more aware of the ways children and adults interact with each other. The Protecting God's Children program educates and trains adults about the dangers of abuse, the warning signs of abuse, the ways to prevent abuse, the methods of properly reporting suspicions of abuse, and responding to allegations of abuse. It is a three-hour live awareness session instructing adults that to protect children you must have continuous awareness and vigilance. This awareness session makes trainees understand the signs of child sexual abuse, the methods and means by which offenders commit abuse, and empowerment steps one can use to prevent child sexual abuse.

We will be holding a Protecting God's Children workshop at All Saints on **Saturday, May 5th, 9:00 AM in the Activities Building**. This workshop is mandatory for all volunteers and employees of the Diocese of Pittsburgh and it is also highly recommended for parents, grandparents and all those who work with children. **The workshop only has to be taken once so if you have taken it in the past, you do not have to take it again.** There is no charge to attend. Those of you old enough to remember know Joe's inspiration – "The Joy of Painting with Bob Ross". While Joe didn't have the large hair of his mentor, he did share the soft-spoken demeanor. YOU ARE THE WITNESSES OF THESE THINGS

To be a witness to something can have a double meaning. On the one hand, a witness is someone who sees something occur, in order that they might tell others about it. Unless we are nearly 2,000 years old, we are not witnesses in the first sense to the life, passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. Yet, by faith, we are witnesses in the second sense. By our baptism we are called to witness to the love of God through our words and actions which are to be reflections of the love of Jesus. In the coming weeks and months, the *On Mission for The Church Alive!* initiative will ask us to build new relationships with nearby parishes, an opportunity to witness to the love of God alive in our hearts. While this may seem like a burden to some, it is at the heart of the Christian life as we build up the Body of Christ, the Church. Jesus continues his resurrection tour of making appearances after he had risen to his disciples in today's Gospel from Luke. The

Gospel tells us of two disciples who recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread. In the other lectionary years, we get a fuller account of this encounter of two disciples meeting Jesus on their way to Emmaus and only recognizing him when he breaks bread and shares the cup in the same way as the last supper. We have the same opportunity to share a meal with the risen Jesus at every Eucharist! Hopefully we are as "incredulous for joy" and "amazed" to be in his presence and receive him at Mass, as these two disciples were meeting him resurrected for the first time. Jesus also discussed with them what the scriptures prophesized about his role as Christ, and their role (and ours) as disciples. The scripture calls us to preach repentance and forgiveness in his name. For those of us in music ministry, every time we exercise our ministry as musicians, we are doing our small part in preaching his salvation and forgiveness to all. We all are called as disciples to proclaim his salvation to the world, but it is up to each of us to find our own way of doing so.
