On the Road

One central metaphor employed to describe the Christian life is a journey. In today's second reading, Peter addresses the early Christian community: "Conduct yourselves with reverence during the time of your sojourning" (1 Peter 1:17). When we think of a journey, we normally think of some kind of movement from point A to point B. The Christian journey, begun in the waters of baptism (point A) has as its ultimate destination eternal life with God in heaven (point B). Unfortunately we find ourselves on all kinds of detours along the way. Because of sin, we make foolish turns and sometimes seem unable to detect the presence of the Lord. Today's story of the two disciples on their way to Emmaus illustrates for us the fact that, even when we are dejected or on one of our many detours, the Lord is there, walking right beside us.

From the desk of the Administrator

We continue "Liturgical Mystagogy" this week. Remember, it's a 5-10 minute period after Mass where you simply reflect on and share if there was a word or phrase in a hymn, a reading, the homily, or the prayers that struck you at Mass today. Come and try it!

Also, "Forty Minutes with Jesus" continues until June 2nd. The first 30 minutes is for your own silent prayer and spiritual reading. At 7:00 PM, we pray the Liturgy of the Hours, Evening Prayer. It's a good way to continue to grow in your life of prayer.

Today we rejoice with eleven of our young women and men who come to the Lord's Table for their First Communion. It always exciting to see the joy in their faces.


So, if our First Communicants are so excited, why aren't we excited to receive the Lord? I offer you a few thoughts on how we can be more excited to receive our Lord. We can be better in our full, conscious, and active participation at Mass.

Maybe one way to be excited is to grade yourself in your general "liturgical deportment", a.k.a., liturgical behavior. As I've often said, you need to see yourselves from my viewpoint. I look out and see people's postures of "I dare you to make me participate". Really? I see people who don't sing or even respond to prayers. This is a community effort. Again, go to a sporting event, the theatre, watch television, and NEVER REACT to what is transpiring. Why can you "participate" in those venues but not in Church?


Maybe another way is to consider how we approach the table of the Lord itself. As an ordinary minister of Holy Communion, sometimes I wonder what people are thinking as they receive Communion. I watch some people greet people prior to and after their reception of Communion, as if that greeting is more important than the Lord. How about how you receive Communion? Cyril of Jerusalem in the 4th century said to consider someone sprinkling gold dust in your hand; therefore, cradle in your hands this precious Gift. Of course, you can also receive on the tongue. When the minister offers you the Host or Precious Blood, your "Amen" says that you not only believe it is Christ, you affirm your love for Him. You can't imagine how some people receive or respond.

See you in Church – more aware of what you are and aren't doing!

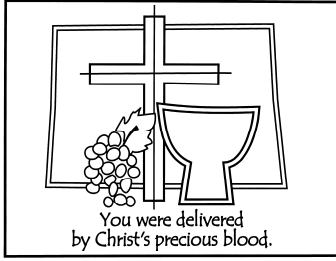
HE HAS MADE KNOWN TO THEM IN THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD.

This Sunday's Gospel is the familiar story of the Road to Emmaus, where the disciples meet Christ on the road without realizing who he was and only recognize him when he breaks the bread. How appropriate that All Saints Parish celebrates First Holy Communion this Sunday with this particular Gospel reading! A group of our young people will come forward and recognize Christ in the Eucharist as they receive it for the first time, like the disciples did in the Gospel. For those of us who have already received the sacraments of initiation, we too have the chance to recognize Christ anew in the Blessed Sacrament each time we attend Mass. Every Mass is Christ revealing himself to us – in the Eucharist, in the Word, in the prayers and songs, and also in one another. At every Eucharistic celebration we are present in a special way for his birth, his life and teaching, his suffering and death on the cross, and ultimately his glorious resurrection from the grave! It is up to us to recognize him, as the disciples did on the road to Emmaus, as he reveals himself to us both inside the Church as well as in our daily lives.
