Prayer: Dependence on God and Communicating with God.

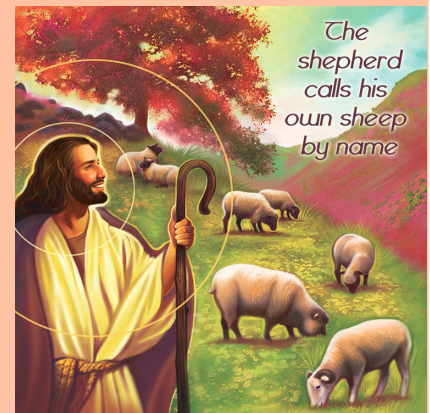
Ministry: Having knowledge of the faith and putting it into practice.

The Call Of The Good Shepherd

The Twenty-third Psalm, today's responsorial psalm, is arguably the best known of all the psalms. The line that reads "Even though I walk in the dark valley / I fear no evil; for you are at my side / with your rod and your staff / that give me courage" (Psalm 23:4) connects this week's scriptures to the wonderful story of the road to Emmaus, which we heard last week. The Lord Jesus, our Good Shepherd, is constantly at our side. He calls us each by name, beckoning us into a deeper relationship with him. That call, issued to each of us at the moment of our baptism, carries with it the promise of the Good Shepherd: "I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly" (John 10:10).

From the desk of the Administrator

The other week the On Mission Team and I attended the District Meeting. I need to share with you what took place at that meeting.

I also apologize for the shortness of all this. I am truly sorry for that.

As you have seen in the media, we are no longer talking about models. We are discussing "parish groupings".

Remember there had been ELEVEN (11) parishes involved with the previous models. The parishes were: St. Scholastica, St. Juan Diego, St. Joseph (O'Hara), St. Mary (Glenshaw), St. Ursula, St. Bonaventure, St. Sebastian, Holy Spirit, St. Nicholas, Most Holy Name, and St. Aloysius.

In meetings at the clergy level, a number of our neighbors were suggesting that we didn't belong with them. I had to agree.

So, what then IS our grouping? Officially it's us, St. Mary (Glenshaw), St. Ursula, St. Bonaventure, Holy Spirit, and St. Nicholas. While this space doesn't allow me to give you the full scoop, the basic numbers are 4,600 Mass goers in 2016; a future of THREE (3) campuses; and a future of TWO (2) Priests serving the grouping.

Because you want to know more, I need to lay out how we will be proceeding to have you give your feedback to give a final voice to this all. The process dates look like this:

14 May – with Mother's Day and all, I know, sorry, there will be a bulletin insert that will give you all the information. It will also give you some questions for reflection.

TWO (2) Town Hall meetings will take place. One is 18 May from 7:30-9:00 PM. The other is 19 May from 2:30-4:00 PM. Both are in the Activities Building. It is here that more details can be given in person and your official feedback sought in a way as easily as possible to collate. If you are a regular Mass goer here, you MUST make it your duty to come to one of these meetings. I have no choice but to "Catholic Guilt" you into attending. Sorry.

21 May – the On Mission Team as well as the Parish Pastoral and Finance Councils will meet to discuss all of your feedback.

28 May – all of the feedback will be presented to the Parish.

1 June – the official feedback form is due to the Diocese.

Quick I know. I am sorry. I will give you more next week.

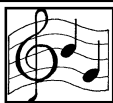
A Murder Mystery Dinner

BOX

We are all familiar with the 23rd Psalm, known more commonly as “The Lord is my Shepherd”. It is practically the standard Psalm used at funeral liturgies, and is also our Psalm today on this “Good Shepherd” Sunday. The psalmist declares that if we make the Lord our Shepherd we will not want. The Lord will provide for us in all ways: we will not hunger, we will not thirst, we will be protected from harm, we will be guided in “right paths”, and we will live in the Lord's house all the days of our lives. It is a good life for the Lord's sheep! Jesus, in the Gospel reading, proclaims himself to be the Shepherd as well as the gate for the sheep. The only way that we can join the fold of the Lord's sheep is through Christ. The first reading clues us in that we enter the flock through Christ by way of our baptism. So for all of us who have been baptized, the Lord *is* our shepherd! He is a good shepherd who laid down his life for his sheep, that we “might have life and have it more abundantly”!
