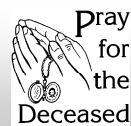

BOX

The Easter season has reached its end this Sunday with the Solemnity of Pentecost, where we recall the descent of the Holy

Spirit upon the apostles on the very first Pentecost. It is considered to be the birthday of the Church, as the apostles were moved by the Spirit to go out and begin preaching the Gospel of Christ to the world. This mission, of course, continues to this very day with us, still led by the same Holy Spirit that descended upon the apostles on the first Pentecost. The color red is symbolic of the tongues of fire that accompanied the Spirit, and red vestments are worn by the priest on Pentecost for this reason. There are a variety of hymns specifically associated with Pentecost, such as “Come, Holy Ghost”. A very special hymn, which is part of the liturgy on Pentecost Sunday, is the sequence, *Veni Sancte Spiritus* (Come, Holy Spirit). This sequence hymn calls on the Holy Spirit to send its heavenly light upon us, give us comfort, cleanse us, and impart its seven-fold gifts upon us. The Gospel acclamation verse expresses our petition to the Holy Spirit on Pentecost: “Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of the faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.”
