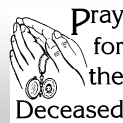

The second half of Ordinary Time begins in an extraordinary way with the solemnities of Trinity Sunday and Corpus Christi (The

Body and Blood of Christ). Pope Francis described the link between the two solemnities in this way: "The Eucharist is like the 'burning bush' in which the Trinity humbly dwells and communicates." Trinity Sunday celebrates the doctrine of the Trinity, the belief that there are three persons in one God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. On Trinity Sunday, hymns that praise the Trinity are often sung, for example, "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God Almighty". Interestingly, when God the Father is represented in art, he is often shown having a halo shaped as an equilateral triangle. The equilateral triangle represents the three persons of the Trinity, as it has three equal sides.
