The mission of All Saints Parish is to expand the Kingdom of God by showing people the way to salvation through the Eucharist, in our faith, our compassion, and our actions.


This is showcased in our four core values, namely:

From the Desk of the Administrator

The following report was submitted to the Diocese as a result of our consultation. See the enclosed survey for particular details.

What are the strengths of the Parish Grouping?

People offered a number of general strengths to the grouping. People seemed to like that most of the grouping shares the Shaler School District. It was felt that we could work together. It was stated that parking is readily available at most of the churches. There seems to be a diversity from an economical perspective. It was felt that these parishes are community minded. If one drives, there are reasonable travel times.

When considering the strength of the parish grouping in relationship to the municipalities and non-church communities, there were many strengths noted. It was felt that a lot can be gained from this grouping with the combined resources and an ability for evangelization. There was also a strong desire for an enduring presence in the Etna Community.

Is this Parish Grouping the best relationship of parishes? Why or Why not?

Truly it is hard to discern if this is the best relationship of parishes from those who participated in the survey. On a weighted scale of 1 (Strongly Agree) to 5 (Strongly Disagree) our survey produced an average of 3.43 to the grouping of All Saints (Etna), Saint Bonaventure (Glenshaw), Holy Spirit (Millvale), Saint Mary of the Assumption (Middle Road, Glenshaw), Saint Nicholas (Millvale), and Saint Ursula (Allison Park). In a further drilling down, 25% expressed that it was the best relationship of parishes. However, 36% believed that All Saints would be better off with St. Joseph (O'Hara Twp.), St. Juan Diego (Sharpsburg), and St. Scholastica (Aspinwall) instead. Interesting were the suggestions of the remaining 39%. They suggested 52 different combinations! St. Bonaventure appeared in 27 of the suggested groupings. The list continued naming St. Juan Diego (mentioned 16 times), Holy Spirit (15 times), St. Nicholas (14 times), St. Mary (Glenshaw) and St. Ursula were tied (13 times), St. Joseph (O'Hara) [8 times], St. Aloysius (6 times), and St. Scholastica (5 times). No combinations included Most Holy Name of Jesus and St. Sebastian.

What alternative would you propose to make the grouping better?

While the grouping was nebulous, it seemed that two general alternatives were suggested. When asked if three campuses were enough in the proposed grouping, 19% said yes. However, 27% of those surveyed felt that four campuses would be needed, especially based on the estimated number of Mass goers. In addition, with the number of funerals (averaging five a week), an additional priest was recommended.

What are your concerns/suggestions related to implementation for this group?

There were various concerns regarding this grouping. Many felt it would be too large. There was a concern for the work load on the Priests assigned to the parish. There was a great concern about transportation. If one does not drive or is elderly, these distances are inconvenient. There was also a sense of the loss of a localized community presence as everyone is spread out. It would be catastrophic for Etna and Millvale to lose the presence of a church. It was felt that perhaps the spiritual needs of parishioners will not be met. Perhaps people will stop going to church or want to join or support a church. There was a great concern that larger parishes with more money will "take over" and smaller parishes will not be heard.

Please note top themes of feedback from parishioners related to this parish grouping

Transportation. Size of the parish. Care for the elderly. Realization that more resources could be possible. The damage done if the Church leaves a community.



This Monday is Memorial Day, where we remember all those who died in service to our country. We pray for their souls, and we also pray for peace and an end to war in the world.




