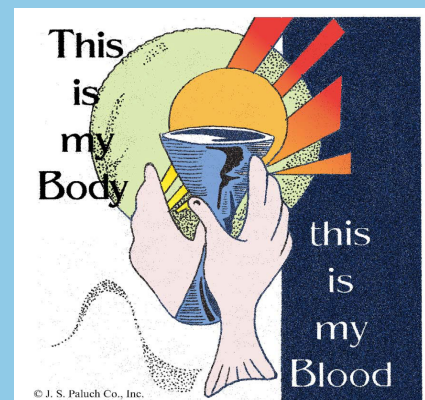
Reconciliation: Saturdays 12:30 - 1:00 PM and after the 5:00 PM Mass.

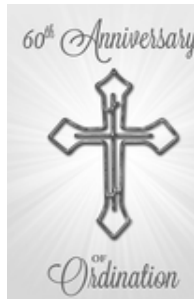
High School Men

Perhaps so appropriate is the fact that Fr. Lutz's celebration is taking place on the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, better known by its Latin title, Corpus Christi. At the heart of priestly ministry is the celebration of the Eucharist. I am sometimes convinced that we take the Eucharist for granted. We are privileged to have Mass every day. Within a few minutes we can be at another Catholic Church to share in their Eucharistic celebration should we miss one here. Yet in many parts of the world, they don't have regular access to the graces available at Mass. As we see shrinking numbers of Priests in our Diocese, we too may be experiencing the lack of Eucharistic graces.

The liturgist in me laments seeing folks like bumps on a log during Mass. I challenge you yet again to watch a sporting event, movie, play, whatever and NEVER react to what is taking place. Don't cheer, don't cry, don't jump at the surprise, just sit there with your arms crossed looking like you could care less. Friends, do ME this favor, come with hungry souls to the great feast that is the Eucharist. There is a phrase in the priestly circles that is appropriate here: "Celebrate this Mass like it's your first Mass, your last Mass, your only Mass."



Of course, tomorrow is the celebration of Memorial Day. While often the official start to the summer season, let's remember it's REAL PURPOSE – commemorating the men and women who have paid the ultimate sacrifice to protect our way of life. May these soldiers, sailors, and pilots rest in peace knowing our appreciation for what they have done for us. And more importantly, may true peace come to this crazy world around us.



On the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, you may leave the liturgy wondering who Melchizedek is and why the first reading and the psalm are focused on him. What does Melchizedek have to do with the Body and Blood of Christ?

Melchizedek was the king of Salem as well as a priest in the Old Testament. His name means “my king is righteousness” in Hebrew. As we hear in the first reading, he brings out bread and wine to bless Abram; the bread and wine being an obvious connection to the Eucharist. In the Letter of Paul to the Hebrews in the New Testament, Paul makes an association between Jesus and Melchizedek – namely that Jesus is “a priest forever in the order of Melchizedek”. This is a reference to Psalm 110, which is our Responsorial Psalm today. Melchizedek is so connected to the Eucharist, he is mentioned by name in Eucharistic Prayer I. It turns out that Melchizedek has much to do with Christ and the Eucharist, and this is why he is a central figure in today's liturgy.

The roots of the priesthood are also tied to the tradition of Melchizedek, and it is fitting that this weekend Fr. Lutz celebrates his 60th anniversary of ordination. To serve as priest for 60 years tremendously benefits the Church and the world! From all involved with the All Saints music ministry, we thank him for his many years of blessed service. May God grant him many more years in health and happiness!
