Hope and Life

Today's readings tell the story of two widows. The first reading relates the plight of the widow with whom the prophet Elijah stayed; the Gospel tells about the widow of Nain. In each story, the widow's only son had died. For people who lived in those cultures, the son was the only support of a widow, and the carrying on of the family name by the son was equal to immortality. A widow whose only son has died could lose all hope.



Elijah and Jesus are the restorers of hope; they bring the sons back to life. Saint Paul was metaphorically raised from the dead when he experienced the conversion and call from God that he describes in today's second reading.

What are Christians called to do today? We may not be able to raise the dead, but perhaps we can rekindle hope for a single parent. We may not be able to convert a persecutor like Paul, but if we speak the gospel openly and gently with our lives, we might touch a life with the Good News.

From the Desk of the Administrator

This week I need to talk about the On Mission Planning Process. At my invitation, April Miller, Sherry Rectenwald, Tom Rishel, Michael Roos, and Judy Weisman, have agreed to serve our parish as On Mission Parish Team Leaders. Their primary responsibilities include: Participating in consultation sessions to generate feedback on proposed district models and engaging and collecting your feedback on future models of parish life. They will summarize the feedback from you using the tools provided so that the On Mission Commission can benefit from the insights of parishioners. Please pray for them and all involved as we journey On Mission for The Church Alive!

Let's ponder some facts about our being On Mission for the Church Alive! from our district snapshot. These facts may astound you!

Our district includes nine parishes. It encompasses us, as well as St. Juan Diego, Sharpsburg, St. Joseph, O'Hara, St. Scholastica, Aspinwall, St. Joseph, Verona, St. Irenaeus, Oakmont, St. Gerard Majella, St. Susana, and St. Bartholomew—all in Penn Hills.

What is the seating capacity of the nine parishes? The total seating capacity is 6,142 people in the 11 church buildings.

How many Sunday Masses are celebrated each weekend? There are 29 Masses to fulfill the Sunday Obligation.

Alright, now some math with the underlying numbers. So, between the 11 buildings there is seating for 178,118 people each Sunday! Now, guess how many registered Catholics are in our District and how many come to Mass???? The registrations in 2015 were 18,084 and the "Mass goers" numbered 5,016!

There are interesting numbers regarding the Catholic population. There were 119 infant baptisms and 254 deaths in 2015. Therefore, twice as many people died as were baptized.

We can also talk about staffing at the parishes. There are seven Priests, two Deacons, seven full time Lay Ecclesial Ministers (like DREs, Pastoral Associates, etc), and 14 part time LEMs serving the nine parishes.

I am becoming more and more a proponent that the On Mission process is about the Paschal Mystery – suffering, death, resurrection, and new life. Let's keep our faith strong in following Christ in the process.

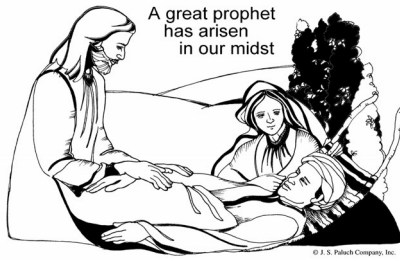
