This is showcased in our four core values, namely:

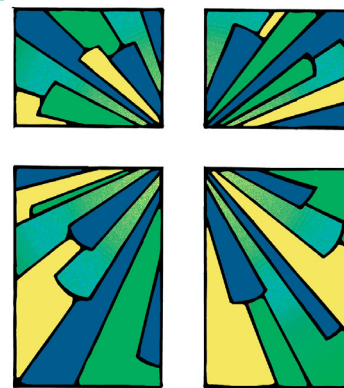
Prayer: Dependence on God and Communicating with God.

From the desk of the Administrator

I ask for your prayers this week. The reason is quite simple. I will be with my family for our annual vacation together! There will be ten of us in one house with three dogs and two rabbits. As I always tease, someone is NOT coming back alive! Actually, it's good to be with them and even better for me to be away. However, an extra prayer won't hurt! Thanks for that.

Often, in the bigger Church circles, this time of year is known as "Ordination Season".

Ordinations happen in the month of May. As you might recall last month both Fr. Garry Patriquin and Fr. Jerry Lutz celebrated their 33rd and 61st anniversaries respectively of ordination. On May 20th I had the privilege to be with Bishop Zubik for the ordination of Fr. Peter Gruber of the Congregation of the Oratory.

Ordinations happen in the month of June. Yesterday, I was with Bishop again for the ordination of three new Capuchin Priests: Albert Carver, Jonathan Ulrick, and James Watson, Jr. Today we recall Deacon Ross Dacal's 6th anniversary of ordination. Finally, on June 25th yours truly will celebrate 23 years as a Priest. *Ad multos annos.* – to many more years!

It is important to talk about "Ordination Season" as a reminder to you all to please pray for all the clergy! We need your prayerful support. Often people ask me how I can do all that I do. Teasingly I say I don't know how I do it. Actually, I know how I am able to do it. It is through the support of your prayers.

Know that this call for prayer is a reciprocal arrangement; we clergy pray for all of you in return. I can tell you that each morning, when I am privately praying in Church, and each time I offer the "Mass for the People of the Parish", I ask God to watch over All Saints, especially as we move into an uncertain future. Honestly, prayer makes all of us stronger and better. And the more we pray for each other, the better the world will be.

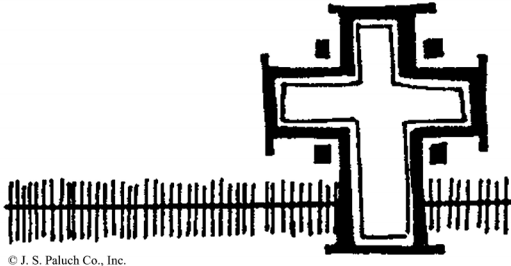
