This is showcased in our four core values, namely:

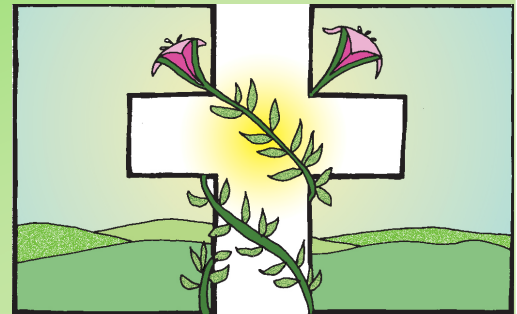
Prayer: Dependence on God and Communicating with God.

BOX

The liturgy for this Sunday has us doing a little liturgical time traveling. We are headed back to revisit the themes of the Lenten season, repentance and forgiveness. With repentance and forgiveness comes also mercy, which is very appropriate as we are still in the Holy Year of Mercy. The psalm for today, taken from Psalm 32, shows that a full confession of our sins to the Lord will lead to forgiveness, then gladness and joy for the forgiven sinner. Jesus, in the Gospel, makes use of a parable to justify why he is so welcoming to sinners. The parable of the creditor and two debtors explains why those who have fallen away from God's love often become the most devout disciples upon returning. Those who have lost the most learn to appreciate the value of what they lost. That is why we always have to be welcoming and hospitable to strangers – they may experience needed conversion and become great lovers of God and workers for the kingdom!


