**Treasures from our Tradition**

*At the heart of today's solemnity is a eucharistic procession, held in many parishes, that calls to mind the procession of Holy Thursday, yet has a purpose different from the somber adoration in the night watch. In the late Middle Ages, a procession through the city with the Blessed Sacrament was an occasion of heartfelt joy and great emotion. In a time when people seldom approached the altar to receive Holy Communion, the procession through the streets, past homes and workplaces, was a vibrant reminder that Christ was with them as a dear companion and guide.*

*Every year on this day, a joyful procession winds through the streets of Rome from the Lateran cathedral. A few years ago, Pope John Paul II, deeply moved at the sight of the throng accompanying the sacred host, said that we ought to feel profoundly united with the faithful everywhere in the world at such a moment. "Before our mind's eye all the Churches of the world, from East to West, from North to South, are present." Originally this feast was on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday, but after the calendar reform of 1970, its title was expanded from "Corpus Christi" to "The Body and Blood of Christ" and in the United States it was moved to the Sunday after Trinity Sunday. Even though Easter season ended two weeks ago, this beautiful feast is aglow with Easter light.*

**Pro Life Brief**

"God uses creation to bring us into loving relationship with himself, most notably through the sacraments. We experience this most powerfully in the Eucharist, the true body and blood of Christ, received under the appearance of bread and wine, where 'all that has been created finds its greatest exaltation' (LS 236)." **From the desk of the Administrator**

First, a word of appreciation on this Father's Day to all the fathers, grandfathers, godfathers, fatherly figures in our lives for the witness that they have given to us. Of course, we are most thankful for THE Father, God in heaven, for this beautiful creation of His, the world in which we live. Happy Father's Day!

As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord, formerly known by its Latin title, *Corpus Christi*, I share with you a treatise by Saint Gaudentius of Brescia, Bishop. It was in the Office of Reading, one of the Liturgy of the Hours, a few weeks back. It's a great reflection for today.

"One man has died for all, and now in every church in the mystery of bread and wine he heals those for whom he is offered in sacrifice, giving life to those who believe and holiness to those who consecrate the offering. This is the flesh of the Lamb; this is his blood. The bread that came down from heaven declared: The bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world. It is significant, too, that his blood should be given to us in the form of wine, for his own words in the gospel, I am the true vine, imply clearly enough that whenever wine is offered as a representation of Christ's passion, it is offered as his blood. This means that it was of Christ that the blessed patriarch Jacob prophesied when he said: He will wash his tunic in wine and his cloak in the blood of the grape. The tunic was our flesh, which Christ was to put on like a garment and which he was to wash in his own blood.

"Creator and Lord of all things, he brought forth bread from the earth and changed it into his own body. It is the Lord's Passover. We are no longer to look upon the bread and wine as earthly substances. They have become heavenly, because Christ has passed into them and changed them into his body and blood. What you receive is the body of him who is the heavenly bread, and the blood of him who is the sacred vine; for when he offered his disciples the consecrated bread and wine, he said: This is my body, this is my blood.

"When Christ told the crowds that they must eat his flesh and drink his blood, they were horrified and began to murmur among themselves: This teaching is too hard; who can be expected to listen to it? As I have already told you, thoughts such as these must be banished."

**BOX**

This Sunday, we are celebrating the second of the two solemnities that begin the long stretch of Ordinary Time following Easter –

the feast of Corpus Christi, or The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. As you might guess from the title, this solemnity is a celebration of the great gift of Christ’s Body and Blood in the Eucharist. While the Eucharist certainly is in many ways the crown jewel of our faith, Pope Francis reminds us in his Apostolic Exhortation, *Evangelii Gaudium*, that the Eucharist is “not a prize for the perfect, but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak.” The Church is sometimes described as a “hospital for sinners”, and the Eucharist (Christ’s true Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity) is the miracle cure that gives us life not only here on earth, but eternal life in heaven! Jesus tells us in the Gospel reading that “whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day.” This is why the Eucharist is considered the source and summit of our Catholic faith, and God has blessed us greatly to be able to “taste and see the goodness of the Lord” in the Holy Eucharist!

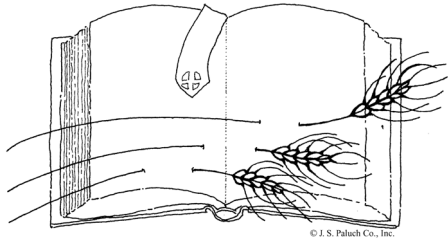
