Prayer: Dependence on God and Communicating with God.

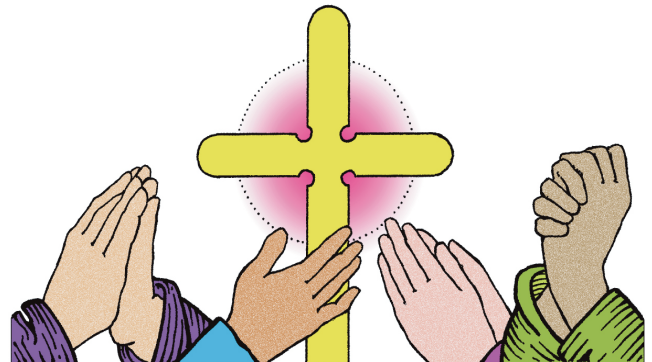

Follow in the Footsteps of Christ

The great fifty-day celebration of Easter has concluded, as have the feasts honoring the Holy Trinity and the Body and Blood of Christ. Last week we began a long stretch of Ordinary Time that will bring us to late November. Saint Paul tells us today that those who are baptized "have clothed yourselves with Christ" (Galatians 3:27). This scripture is echoed in the Church's baptism ritual when we sing, "You have put on Christ, in him you have been baptized." This message is inspiring and sobering at the same time, for in today's Gospel, we get to the heart of what it means to be clothed in Christ. The Lord tells us, "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23). For the next twenty-two weeks we are called to take up the cross and, with Saint Luke as our guide, follow in the footsteps of Christ.

So, let me share some other On Mission stats with you. Remember there are nine parishes in our district. The numbers will reflect the district first; then All Saints. Buckle your seat belt!



Parish Territorial

Trends: The total general population in 2010 was 64,700. It is estimated to be 63,809 in 2020. That's a decrease of 1.38%. For us, the 2010 population was 7,127. It is anticipated to be 6,863. That's a decrease of 3.70%.

Registrations: The total registrations in the district in 2010 was 20,833. In 2015 it was 18,694. That's a decrease of 10%. For All Saints the numbers are 2,315 and 2,207. That's a decrease of 5%.

Mass Attendance: The total Mass attendance in 2010 was 6,062. In 2015 it was 5,015. That's a decrease of 17%. For All Saints the numbers are 491 and 419. That's a decrease of 15%.

Baptisms: The total infant baptisms from 2010-2015 was 812. In that time All Saints baptized 69 infants.

Deaths: The total number of deaths from 2010-2015 was 1,543. We lost 170 souls in that same time period.

Marriages: The total number of marriages from 2010-2015 was 345. We had 26.

Confirmations: The total number of youth confirmations from 2010-2015 was 1,140. We confirmed 107.

Religious Education: In 2014-2015 there were 1,112 children in K-8. We had 106. Now the distribution in the district: K-50; 1st-107; 2nd-126; 3rd-133; 4th-131; 5th-127; 6th-155; 7th-142; 8th-141. Our enrolment: K-4; 1st-10; 2nd-12; 3rd-13; 4th-18; 5th-16; 6th-10; 7th-10; 8th-13.

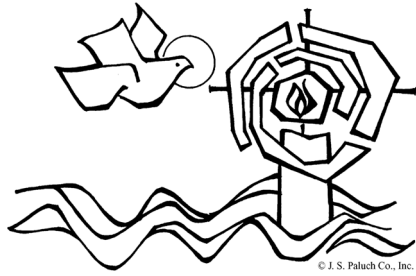
