Prayer: Dependence on God and Communicating with God.

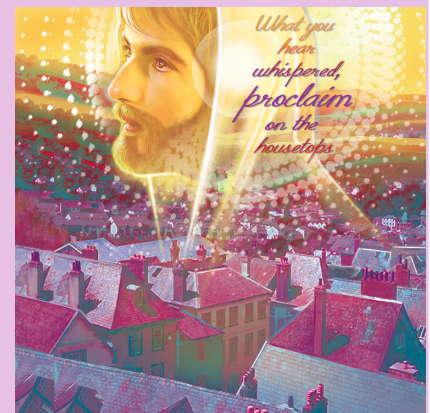

Free Lunch for Kids & Teens

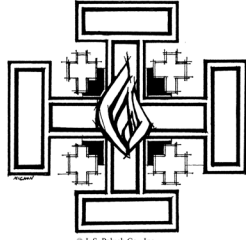


