There are a couple of things which require me to play catch-up. They are as follows.

Our **All Saints Music Ministry** has completed their Envisioning Process. It is as follows.

The Music Ministry of All Saints exists to use prayer and song to lead and foster congregational participation in joyful praise of God. Our ministry fills the church with song by the leadership of cantors, choir and folk group. The Resurrection Choir provides consolation and comfort to grieving families by singing at every funeral. Every member of All Saints Music Ministry serves as a model for the congregation by singing and participating at Mass. We help to provide a prayerful atmosphere for each to worship in his/her own way. We enhance the sacramental life of the parish by our music at Masses for First Communion, Weddings, and Confirmations. We educate the parish community through rehearsals, and the articles published in the bulletin each week. We serve the greater community by participating in the Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service each year. We strive to develop and maintain the personal vocation to the ministry of each of our members, which helps them and others grow closer to God.

Five additional ways we can serve the community this year are as follows:

1. Hosting a Christmas HymnSing for our parish community in December.
2. Growing and developing a Youth Choir in cooperation with Religious Education program of our parish.
3. Visiting the Etna Commons for Christmas for singing and fellowship.
4. Choir will sing for a First Friday Evening Prayer in Advent and Lent.
5. Continuing efforts to recruit new members to all groups of our music ministry.

All Saints Music Ministry is open to all people who have musical talent and a love for God and his Church. Adult choir meets most Thursday evenings between September and May. Folk Group meets one Monday evening per month between September and May.

Why liturgy? That is a question that many of us wonder about from time to time. I recently viewed a video where Marty Haugen, one of the more popular composers of liturgical music, attempted to answer this very question. On reason he felt that liturgy was necessary is the variety of readings that we hear each week. If we chose them ourselves, we would naturally gravitate towards our favorites and ignore other parts of scripture entirely. Thanks to our Lectionary, especially since the three year cycle was introduced after Vatican II, we hear a large portion of the scriptures at Mass, likely much more than we would if we chose the readings ourselves.

Another reason why we choose liturgy as our principal form of worship is the connection and continuity it gives us to worshipers of the past and future. In our liturgy, we use many of the same hymns and prayers as even the early disciples did. We have an assurance in our liturgy that in the future, people will still be praying and singing as we do currently. Yes, there have been changes over time, but they generally occur gradually and organically. This continuity emphasizes the timelessness of our prayer to the God who is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow.


## **Big wrap-up Saturday night**
