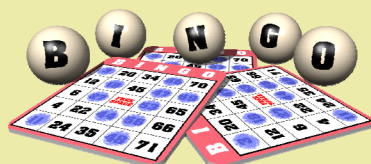

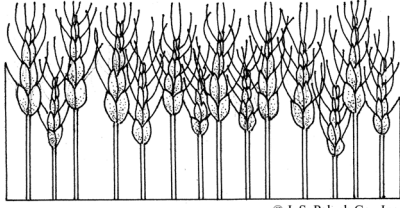

From the desk of the Administrator

This past week, I had to share some news with our Food Bank clients. Today I share it with you:

"Regretfully, I must inform you that for various reasons the All Saints Food Bank is closing as of December 31, 2017. The reasons include and are not limited to the following: the decreasing number of families served; the lack of a functioning, reliable refrigerator/freezer and the cost to replace it; decreasing accessibility; managerial issues with oversight and ordering; and the availability of nearby food pantries with greater options of products and services.

"Our Food Bank Staff feels you could be better served at other locations. These locations include the following:

"1. Bread of Life Food Pantry - Calvert Presbyterian Church, 94 Locust Street, Etna PA 15223, 412-781-3056;

"2. St. Mary's Sharpsburg Food Pantry - 201 9th Street, Sharpsburg, PA 15215, 412-784-8700;

"3. North Hills Community Outreach - 1975 Ferguson Road, Allison Park, PA 15101, 412-487-6316, Option 1;

"NHCO operates three food pantries in the northern suburbs of Pittsburgh (Allison Park, Millvale, and Bellevue)

"Our St. Vincent de Paul Society and Ladies of Charity have been happy to have served so many families in the past. Perhaps either group can assist you going forward for whatever emergency needs may arise. Know too that the parish will continue to include you in our prayers."

I am truly grateful to all the volunteers over the years. Your help was greatly appreciated.

And speaking of wonderful volunteers, don't forget that Festival begins this week! There are dinners, games, food, and fun for all ages. I bet some volunteer slots can still be filled. Sign-up today! 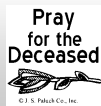

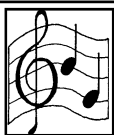

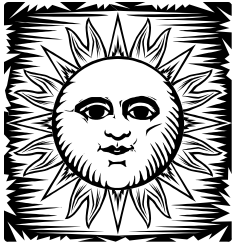
Big wrap-up Saturday night
