Prayer: Dependence on God and Communicating with God.

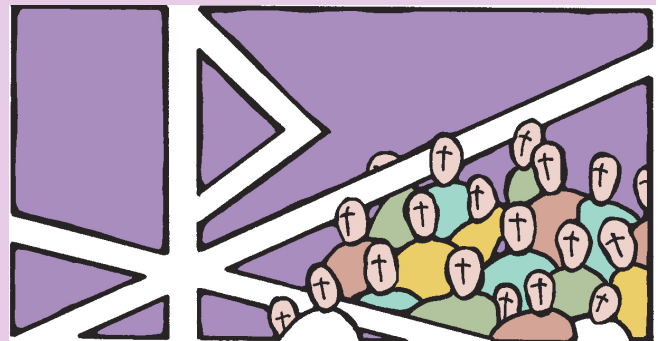

In the Gospel story, Jesus' friend Mary sat at his feet in order to listen to him speak.

How do we welcome and reverence the Lord? What do our actions show? Do we remember the Lord's presence in the Blessed Sacrament? How do we welcome the Lord in the scripture readings? How do we acknowledge his presence in our brothers and sisters, both at Mass and afterwards?

Whether we kneel, stand, or sit in the Lord's presence, may our hearts and minds always be attuned to him.

From the Desk of the Administrator

Due to press time, I will comment more on the festival next week. Hope I saw you there!

Since my arrival, I have made a "big deal" about August 3rd, the date of our founding. Of course, Fr. Keller had arrived in April of 1902. And while history took place in the intervening months, it seems that the date that the first church building of All Saints was dedicated, August 3, 1902, is the official founding of the parish. Like birthdays, we need to celebrate that date. And so we have in my time here.

Yet, as we celebrate the birth of the parish, it is in relationship to another Church, that which houses the Bishop's seat, St. Paul Cathedral, Oakland. We exist because of that Church and altar. It's important that we keep that relationship in mind as well.



So, as you will see in the enclosed flier, we are taking a pilgrimage to the Cathedral to pass through the Holy Door for the Year of Mercy. The date chosen is August 7, 2016, the date nearest to our founding. The day begins with lunch. We will travel to the Cathedral by bus. We will have some time to tour the Cathedral on your own. We will offer Evening Prayer together. We will stay for the Concert Series, which will last about 50 minutes. The concert performed by Donald K. Fellows, music director of the Cathedral, will include some Bach, and, among other things, a suite based on Three Celtic Tunes by the quasi-jazzy Paul Halley. The concert is free. However, there will be a free-will offering. After the concert, we will make our way home. The cost is \$15.00 per person. Seats are limited. So sign up early!

Why would we make a pilgrimage to the Holy Door? Well, let's look at an official quote:

"A holy door or *porta sancta* has been used since the fifteenth century as a ritual expression of conversion. Pilgrims and penitents pass through it as a gesture of leaving the past behind and crossing the threshold from sin to grace, from slavery to freedom, and from darkness to light. Often these rituals are associated with prayer, pilgrimage, sacrifice, confession, and indulgences."

I hope you will join this wonderful pilgrimage opportunity.
