The mission of All Saints Parish is to expand the Kingdom of God by showing people the way to salvation through the Eucharist, in our faith, our compassion, and our actions.


This is showcased in our four core values, namely:

The Mercy, Power, and Love of God

The first reading today, from the book of Wisdom, makes its point over and over, at least five times in five verses! God is mighty, but lenient to all. God's power is shown in kindness and clemency, not in harshness and condemnation, and those who govern God's people must govern in the same way, with kindness. This loving kindness and gentleness is not contrary to God's might, but is a direct result of God's primacy over all. Who are we, then, to judge what is in the hearts of our fellow Christians and all people, when God commands justice with love and clemency?

Likewise, the Holy Spirit makes up for our ignorance of what we need, speaking in a language we do not yet understand. But God knows our needs before we do, understands the intercessions of the Spirit, and helps us in our weakness. This is our hope: God's mercy, power, and love.

As press time is in the midst of festival, I can give a full report on that next week. Stay tuned!

So, I was away to the National Association of Pastoral Musicians annual convention in Cincinnati last week. The theme was "Formed as One: Unity of Voices, Unity of Hearts". As usual, I'd like to share what took place.

The week was filled with celebrities. Ok, not of the Hollywood or sports variety. There were a number of musical composers there. I chatted with my hero, Fr. Paul Turner, a Priest of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph, MO. He is THE BEST liturgical-sacramental theologian in the American Church today – or is that SECOND best??? I chatted with lesser known celebrities, like Sallie. She's from North Carolina. We only see each other at the conventions. While she is engaged in music ministry at her parish, she speaks about the need to overcome drug addictions. Why? Her son died of an overdose a couple years back. Talk about a celebrity, right?

The week was filled with learning. There was lots to be reminded of in the plenum sessions.

Msgr. Rick Hilgartner, former NPM president, reminded us that God calls us together. He further stated that the role of the pastoral musician is to create something beautiful for God.

Dr. Tim O'Malley reminded us that our unity as a Church is in Christ. There is no magic in what we do; we must pass along what was given to us.

Kelly Adamson, in speaking about the Liturgy of the Hours, reminded us that there is a continuity to our prayer across time – past, present, and future joined together – when we pray.

Tony Alonso reminded us how easily we point fingers at "those people" who are "wrong". However, they are doing the same thing in OUR direction! We can find some unity in what we do.

Finally, the triad of Rachelle Kramer, M. Roger Holland, II, and Rita Thiron took us home. Ms. Kramer said we need to get back to the basics. We must be disciples to go make disciples. Mr. Holland said we need to be people of hospitality, integrated, and working together. Ms. Thiron said we need to begin at the end of Mass. The dismissal at Mass says to GO. We need to get the people inside the church building to go out on mission; we can't expect those outside the building to just come in on their own.


