

Keep Praying

St. Monica, whose feast we celebrate in August, is often known as “the persistent mother.” She watched her oldest son, Augustine, turn his back on his Christian faith.

Monica was exasperated. For years she gave up talking directly to her son on the advice of a local bishop, who told her that it was better to talk to God about Augustine than to Augustine about God.

The mother never gave up praying for her son. Eventually Augustine gave up his wild ways, was baptized, and later ordained and named bishop of Hippo. St. Augustine went on to become one of the Church’s greatest scholars.

Today’s readings address the importance of persistent prayer. Abraham, in spite of trepidation that he is bothering the Lord, continues to ask about the fate of Sodom and Gomorrah. Jesus, in Luke’s Gospel, tells his disciples to “ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you” (Luke 11:9). This is our charge: keep praying.



Most of us are familiar with the hymn, "Seek Ye First", but do we really understand what we are singing? For many of us, prayer is our last recourse in a seemingly hopeless situation. When all else fails, we turn to prayer as a last gasp that things may turn out in our favor. There is nothing inherently *wrong* with this approach. I'd bet that many people have had a spiritual awakening when a prayer like this was answered. However, "Seek Ye First" challenges us to turn to prayer *first*, instead of last. The Lord promises us in today's Gospel reading that "everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds." This does not mean that God will give us everything we want – we can't all be Powerball winners, for example. If we go to God in prayer first, and not last, we might find that we do get everything we need!
