We find in this Sunday's Gospel not one, but two parables featuring people willing to lose all that they have to gain something of value.

In the first parable, it is a field with a buried treasure. In the second, it is a pearl of great price. Both individuals sell everything they have to attain these valuable items. Jesus compares these items to the kingdom of heaven. Nothing that we have should be worth more to us than Jesus Christ and his heavenly kingdom! The refrain of our offertory hymn this weekend, "Earthen Vessels" by John Foley, reflects the concept of Christ as the greatest treasure, and connects it with the Eucharist where we encounter Christ directly. *We hold a treasure, not made of gold, in earthen vessels, wealth untold; one treasure only: the Lord, the Christ, in earthen vessels.* The question we should ask ourselves is are we, like the two individuals in the parables, willing to give up everything if necessary to be with Christ in his heavenly kingdom?
