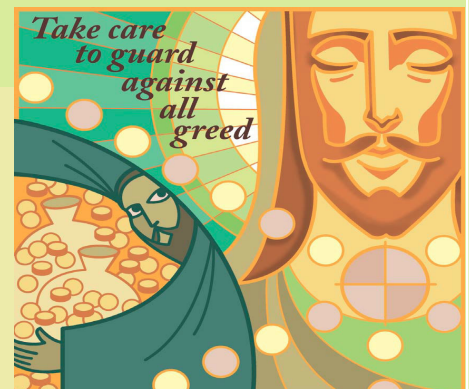

We will not achieve the future security we pursue, and we will lose the present moment in the chase.

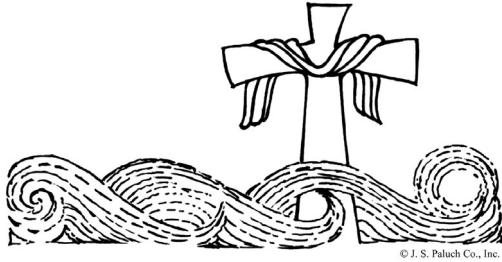
