This is showcased in our four core values, namely:


Prayer: Dependence on God and Communicating with God.

From the Desk of the Administrator

On Monday, we mark the 113th anniversary of the founding of our Parish. Let us be glad and rejoice! Let us ask God to bless us for many more years to come.

When I was visiting our windows the other week, the President of Renaissance Glassworks said, "So, what exactly **is** Founder's Day?" I told him the truth. I said that the parish must honor its founding. It should always be celebrated.

I said that some may call this a "made-up day", yet we honor all kinds of "artificial" celebrations. Sure we celebrate important days, like birthdays and anniversaries. However, there are other "important" dates—be them in family history, our nation's history, even that of our Roman Catholic Church. Why society itself even makes up celebrations: Grandparent's Day, Mother's Day, Father's Day, National Hot Dog Awareness Day, National Donut Day, and the like. I think you get the point. "Important" dates are all around us.

In our case, our early history is a bit nebulous. The story seems to have begun in late 1901. However, the dedication of the first Church building is the date our history honors for our founding. That would be August 3, 1902. Hence the establishment of Founder's Day. Again, let us rejoice that Fr. Keller and the pioneers here were able to do what they did. We can proudly stand on their shoulders. Let us never disappoint them!

And with Founder's Day comes the summer move to the Activities Building for Mass. We shall meet in the cool through the 4th of September.

Our move also reminds us that the windows are being reinstalled, plus the new frames and protective glass. Pray that it all goes on schedule AND for good weather, as that will influence the project's progress too! Because there will be a mess in the Church, we are going to be sealing off the side shrines to keep the dirt out. That's why you aren't able to light the large votive candles today. Your intercession can still reach the Saints through your fervent prayer. Candles will be available when we return. Sorry for any inconvenience this causes.
