

Then departure became 11:30, then 12:30 AM, then to another gate. By that time, the crew had timed out. Then it was moved to 9:00 AM! I was finally able to fly out Tuesday morning at 7:30 AM.

Of course, this Psalm is often connected with the Eucharist, sometimes as a communion hymn, and it is used through these Sundays where we are hearing the Bread of Life discourse for that very reason. At every Mass, we get the opportunity to quite literally taste and see the Lord's goodness in the Blessed Sacrament! For the gift of his Body and Blood, we should do as the Psalmist requests - "bless the Lord at all times" and let his praise be ever in our mouths!
