Parish Membership: New parishioners are always welcome! Call the Parish Office for a census form.

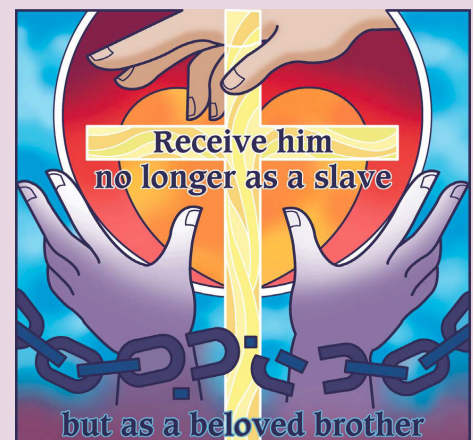



The arrival of September means three things: the kids go back to school, the Steelers start playing meaningful games, and the All Saints Adult Choir and Folk Group resumes for another season. The Adult Choir generally leads the singing at the 10AM liturgy on Sundays, and 7PM on the day of Holy Days but may sing from time to time at other Masses as well. Practices are generally held Thursday nights throughout the season. The first practice for Adult Choir is Thursday, September 8th at 7:30PM in the school.

In addition to the Adult Choir, the Folk Group also returns during the month of September. We still need additional instrumentalists – particularly flute and drums (or other percussion) – as well as singers. Folk Group generally leads the song at the 5PM Mass on the last Saturday of each month, with rehearsal the Monday prior, although I am hoping to have the Folk Group at more Saturday evening Masses if enough people are available. Our first practice is Monday, September 19th, at 7:30PM in the school.
