Sometimes the hour and the person meet. Sometimes, when a task or mission is set upon our shoulders, we know we must meet our responsibilities and we are ready. In both readings, a sense of gravity prevails.

The first reading is from the mysterious Servant Songs from the book of Isaiah. The person is steadfast and brave. His courage and bravery are not located in his stout heart, but in God. We are reminded, "The Lord GOD opens my ear that I may hear" (Isaiah 50:4), so the servant understands the mission. And twice, "The Lord GOD is my help" (50:7, 9), so that the servant can endure the coming struggle.

There are things that never cease to amaze me. Let me reflect on a few of them.

One of them is the sparkly clean Church we returned to last Sunday. Did you notice how clean it was? Thursday and Friday nights found a number of "Saints" sweating profusely to clean the house of the Lord. My best guess is that about 100 hours of work made it that way. I am ever grateful to those who braved the hot, hot Church to make it so clean and orderly. My clothes took two days to dry out! Dearest "Saints", you are to be rewarded for your efforts!

Another amazement is a blog I follow on both the Internet and Twitter called "Whispers in the Loggia". It's written by a man in Philadelphia. It's a Church gossip site, if you will. People constantly wonder how in the world Rocco is able to break the news that he does. He is ALWAYS on target. Anyway, this past Monday evening he mentioned a next day press conference at the Holy See regarding Church annulments. Which leads me to...

Someone else who amazes me, Pope Francis. His recent document for the Latin or Roman Catholic Church (as distinguished from the Eastern Catholic Church, which we know locally as the Byzantine Ruthenian and also the Byzantine Ukrainian Catholic Churches—which received its own document) streamlines the annulment process for divorced and remarried Catholics. Recall that marriage has two sides, the civil and the sacramental. The civil side speaks of the legitimacy of children and rights to property. The sacramental side considers the covenant of love entered by one baptized man and one baptized woman. The annulment process asks the question: Was this man and woman able to enter into a sacramental, spiritual bond at the time of the marriage ceremony? There are a number of reason why they may not have been able to do so. The Pope has simplified the process and the grounds—the reasons—for the lack of a sacramental bond. Even better is that Bishop Zubik has waved all fees for the annulment process. Is this something you or a loved one needs to consider? Give me a call!


