Prayer: Dependence on God and Communicating with God.



From the desk of the Administrator (con't)

Come September, on a date yet to be announced, there will be Day One of the new parish. It is at that point that the clock starts ticking. Parishes will have 2, 3, or 5 years to get organized. It is in that period that assessments are done regarding staffing and buildings. Once the community does its due diligence, they submit everything to the Bishop, including three choices of names, and the parish is officially established.

*Fr. Jim Gretz***From the desk of the Administrator**

I call your attention to the Bulletin Insert for the *On Mission for the Church Alive!* Planning Process. I ask you to consider the reality of the timelines.

At this point, the process is wrapping up the external consultation phase. By the time you read this, Bishop Zubik will have already met with the On Mission Commission, some 80 members strong. They will have presented to him what seems to be the consensus for all the parish groupings. Mind you, THESE ARE NOT THE FINAL GROUPINGS; it's a recommendation being given to Bishop. Those RECOMMENDATIONS will also be shared with the Priests of the Diocese.

What you don't see is the beginnings of the "internal consultation phase", for lack of a better term. Each grouping will go before various Councils and Committees of the Diocese for further vetting and study. Throughout September and October every single active Priest and Deacon will be interviewed concerning their future ministry. There will come a time when groupings will start having clergy assigned to them. I can't even begin to imagine the database necessary to do that work. All of that information will be given to the Bishop who will make the final decisions.

In April of 2018, Bishop will announce all the decisions. Recall that Easter is 1 April – and that's not fooling you! As the information sheet says, he will announce the following: The groupings of the parishes; the clergy (Priests and Deacons) who will be assigned to that parish; the number of Masses for the community given the number of Priests (with the theory that a Priest only offers three Masses on the weekend, so as not to get burned out); and finally the blueprint or the strategy for moving forward.

Once all the announcements are made, the transition phase begins. This is a time for the exiting clergy and the arriving clergy to start passing the baton. There will be assessment tools about Mass times, how Sacraments are celebrated, local Funeral Homes, Parish Pastoral and Finance Council membership, keys, light switches, etc., etc., etc. It's a list of the things from greatest importance to least importance. It will also be up to the transition team to set the Mass schedule for day one. (CON'T TO THE LEFT)


