

Call Upon the Lord

The very first line of today's first reading summons us to seek the Lord and to call upon God. This sentiment is echoed in the refrain for today's responsorial psalm: "The Lord is near to all who call upon him" (Psalm 145:18a). Saint Paul is the embodiment of someone who constantly sought the Lord. In the excerpt we read today from his letter to the Philippians, we find Saint Paul toward the end of his life, a life he describes as completely consonant with Christ. He writes, "For to me life is Christ" (Philippians 1:21). To find out what it means to live life completely in accord with Christ we need look no further than today's Gospel. There we find that God's love and mercy are immeasurable for all those who seek and call upon the Lord.



A couple of updates to give to you. They are in no particular order.

"The Bible and the Mass" is a five week bible study being offered by yours truly this fall. There will be two groups meeting from 6:30 to 8:00 PM. One will take place on Mondays at the Men's Bible Study on 16, 23, and 30 October, 6, and 13 November. The other will take place on Wednesdays for anyone on 11, 18, and 25 October, 8, and 15 November – the Solemnity of All Saints stops the weekly progression. We will be considering the biblical roots of sacrifice which leads to the Eucharist, the seasonal celebrations that lead to the Liturgical Year, how the scriptures teach us how to pray; and finally, two weeks on the Scriptures of the Mass. Sometimes what is fair and what is generous do not always seem to go hand in hand! Today's Gospel reading presents us with the parable of a landowner who hires people to work at his vineyard at various points throughout a day, and then pays them all the same amount regardless of time worked. It may not immediately seem fair that the one who only worked a few hours gets the same payment as the one who worked a full day. Perhaps we must consider that the landowner was paying each an amount that would allow them to provide for themselves and their family, rather than leaving the ones who started later without sufficient funds to meet their needs? Just a thought! The Lord's generosity toward us is without end. Consider that he gave the life of his Son that we, though sinners, might have eternal life. In light of that ultimate generosity, isn't it fair that we be generous towards one another?


