This is showcased in our four core values, namely:

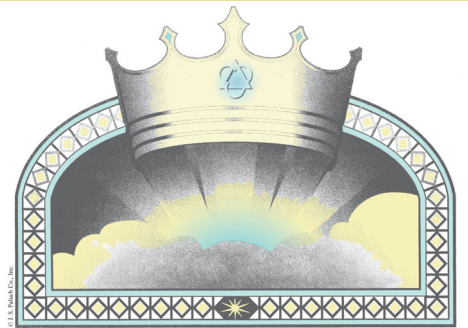
**Prayer:** Dependence on God and Communicating with God.

**Looking Beyond Ourselves**

*The message found in today's readings is an oft-told story. Citizen Kane, Daddy Warbucks, and King Midas are only a few of the familiar fictional characters who thought enormous wealth could buy happiness and fulfillment. Daddy Warbucks admitted stepping on a few people in his climb to the top. Kane tried to buy the printed word and stardom for his young wife, while King Midas conjured immense wealth and tragedy by his very touch.*

*We learn clearly in today's readings that none of this is really possible. True happiness comes from caring for someone other than ourselves. It comes from the pursuit of the virtues Paul described to Timothy: faith, love, gentleness, godliness, righteousness, and endurance. The Gospel reminds us that we dare not ignore the needs of others, acting as though we don't notice their suffering. God's call to us is much too clear to disregard for even one more day.*

**From the Desk of the Administrator**

On Monday evening, the parish On Mission Team and I will be part of a district consultation. This is an opportunity to be introduced to the models for the *On Mission for the Church Alive!* Planning Process. It includes April Miller, Sherry Rectenwald, Mike Roos, Tom Rishel, Judy Weismann. This will be taking place at St. Irenaeus, Oakmont. Please pray for your team.

Speaking of On Mission, I call your attention to the bulletin insert this week. At Baptism you were made a disciple of the Lord. How are you living out that discipleship? Remember that God is holy and He invites us into His holiness. That is how we become holy. So, how is Jesus asking you to live out that holiness? Are you inviting others to experience life as a disciple of Jesus Christ? Are you reminding others of God's call to holiness? Being a disciple takes effort. It requires lots of prayer. It requires doing good works for the glory of God, not ourselves. I challenge all of us to be better disciples. When we are, it will make a difference in the Church and the world.

October is traditionally known as Respect Life Month. Respect for life covers life from conception to natural death. To help us grow in our respect for life, each weekend's bulletin in October will have a pamphlet from the Secretariat of Pro-Life Activities of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. The first one is entitled "Serene Attentiveness to God's Creation". From Pope Francis' encyclical *Laudato si'*, "On Care for Our Common Home" back in time, there has always been concern for our environment. What are you doing to protect our precious environment? It need not be anything big. Something that we do in the rectory is recycle. It's simple enough, yet saves money and landfill space. Think about what YOU can do.

Finally, this week puts me on the road. It is a mix of business and pleasure. On Wednesday, I will be traveling to Queens, NY for the national assembly of the Ladies of Charity USA. I have never been to an assembly. Crazier is that I have never been to New York City! So I am looking forward to both parts of that trip. Today's Gospel gives us yet another reminder of the evils of being wealthy and ignorant to the poor and suffering. We can

probably imagine some people who live this way, that even if the Lord sent someone personally from beyond the grave they wouldn't listen or change the way they live! The readings today also give a message of hope for the poor and suffering. Those who do suffer greatly in this life will certainly be rewarded in the next! This is also echoed in the responsorial psalm from Psalm 146, which is a litany of the various groups of suffering people the Lord pledges to help. While that is great news in and of itself, it is also up to the rest of us to help people suffering and in need. We are the "many parts" of Christ's body, so we must act as one in carrying out the will of God in helping those who need it the most!

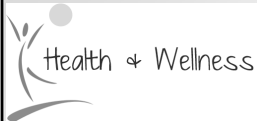
