We welcome those who are interested in becoming Catholics. To enter a program of formation and prayer, contact the Parish Office.



### **From the desk of the Administrator**

It's always interesting what people read and what they comprehend. For instance, last week, I basically wrote fake news in the bulletin. The "truthfulness" of the news started spreading the moment it was posted on the website last Wednesday. So, what lesson does this teach us? Well, maybe I need to not push the envelope in this column. Better still, maybe people should pay attention to the context in which things are spoken. That is THE ONLY THING that will help us successfully navigate *On Mission for the Church Alive!* ALWAYS check the facts. Got it?

Also in last weeks' bulletin was the annual Mass request sheet. That was true!

With the *On Mission for the Church Alive!* Planning Process, there needs to be some changes in how Mass intentions happen. The Bishop has announced that the new groupings will take effect on Monday, 15 October 2018. At that time, a new Mass schedule will be in effect for both weekdays and Sundays.

Take a moment to realize how the new grouping affects Mass intentions. Currently, among our six parishes, there are THIRTY-FIVE (35) weekday Masses and TWENTY-TWO (22) Sunday Masses that were celebrated at first by EIGHT (8) Priests, which has now been reduced to SIX (6) with the transfers of two Parochial Vicars from the grouping. When the end state comes, there are to be TWO (2) Priests officially assigned to the grouping. I believe because of UPMC-Passavant, there will more than likely be a Chaplain assigned to the grouping. THAT IS MY GUESS. A Priest is not to offer more than three Masses on Sunday. Now do the math. Presume the Chaplain is offering Mass at the Hospital maybe daily, and for sure on Sunday. Therefore he is only available maybe for one or two Sunday Masses. With the three Sunday Masses from the two assigned Priests, that's probably no more than EIGHT (8) Masses on Sundays. There will probably be at least ONE (1) weekday Mass. With the number of funerals for the grouping (which was 242 last year) as well as days off and vacations/retreats, the chance of more than one Mass daily is unlikely. So, we will go from FIFTY-SEVEN Masses to probably FOURTEEN! Because of that, we really can't guarantee a specific day for the intention you request and why we ask you to share the day's intention with another. I hope that makes sense.
