Prayer: Dependence on God and Communicating with God.



5. *All models must anticipate growth with respect to parishioner gatherings outside of Mass and growth in staff. Building considerations must include adequate capacity for office, meeting, and gathering space and parking.*

Folks, this is where we shine! We have parking and possibilities for alliances with neighbors to provide additional parking. We have an AWESOME social hall. We have a very handicapped accessible education building.

6. *Viable models must consider present needs for pastoral care and reasonably demonstrate growth or at least sustainability for more than a 20-year time period.*

Is Etna the new Lawrenceville? Who's to say we aren't?

From the Desk of the Administrator

I feel we need to reflect further on the *On Mission for the Church Alive!* Planning Process. Having offered the models, we need to begin reflection on the CRITERIA for the models.

Let's reflect on the six (6) Criteria for Growth and Vibrancy.

1. *Considerations must allow for 25% growth and must allow enough space assuming one Saturday Vigil Mass and two Sunday Masses per priest. Therefore:*

Model 1 – Parish B suggests 5,360 people coming to Mass with 2.2 Priests assigned and up to 6.7 Masses with a current seating capacity of 4,234 people.

Model 4 – Parish A suggests 3,800 people coming to Mass with 1.6 Priests assigned and up to 4.75 Masses and a current seating capacity of 2,674 people.

Model 12 – Parish C, Model 44 – Parish C, and Model 45 – Parish A suggests 3,300 people coming to Mass with 1.4 Priests assigned and up to 4.13 Masses and a current seating capacity of 3,234 people.

2. *Viable models are based on the total population (Catholic and others) of the district.*

Model 1 – Parish B has 32,332 souls.

Model 4 – Parish A has 28,731 souls.

Model 12 – Parish C, Model 44 – Parish C, and Model 45 – Parish A has 21,434 souls.

3. *Viable models for parishes or collaboratives of parishes are based on individual parishioner registrations.*

Model 1 – Parish B currently has 16,881 souls registered.

Model 4 – Parish A currently has 12,408 souls registered.

Model 12 – Parish C, Model 44 – Parish C, and Model 45 – Parish A currently has 9,542 souls registered.

4. *Viable models seek to build upon existing collaboration between parishes when possible.*

The current collaboration found in Models 1, 12, 44, and 45 is the emergency chaplain services at UPMC-St. Margaret.

For the other three parishes (St. Joeseph, St. Juan Diego, and St. Scholastica, plus St. Pio of Pietrelcina) there is collaboration in the regional grade school, Christ the Divine Teacher Catholic Academy.

The message of this Sunday's liturgy is one of hope in the resurrection and eternal life promised us by Christ. Jesus

points out in the Gospel that God "is not the God of the dead, but of the living," and that the faithful who die "are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise." The funeral liturgy carries this same message of hope to those who mourn that their loved one who has passed is not dead, but is alive in Christ, and that they too have the same promise of eternal life for themselves. At every funeral we say the prayer: "Eternal life grant unto them, O Lord, and may perpetual light shine upon them." In the *Saints of God* hymn, we petition the saints for their intercession to assist the person's soul in being admitted quickly into the kingdom of heaven. We sing another hymn called the *In Paradisum* or *May the Choirs of Angels* that asks for the angels and martyrs to greet the person's soul and lead them into paradise. One of the greatest comforts our faith provides is the tremendous hope we have in the resurrection, even in the midst of earthly sorrow.




