

the campuses in the new parish! The other side of this is "football rivalry". While another school or school district was the opposition, they are NOT the enemy. We MUST BE working together.

11. Viable models take into consideration existing relationships and connections among communities. We discussed this one a bit last week and in number 10. We have not done well in working with our neighboring Catholic parishes. While we do a few things with the other religious congregation, we can do more. That same holds true in our relationship with Etna Borough and Shaler Township.

12. Viable models take into account, when available, the parish maps of where registered parishioners live in relationship to their current parish territorial boundaries As you may recall, this was one of our Pastoral Plan plans. We really need to work on our census and the plotting of congregants to help everyone have a better understanding of where we live and worship.

From the Desk of the Administrator

We need to continue discussing the On Mission for the Church Alive! planning process criteria. Last week I talked about the criteria for Growth and Vibrancy, this week I want us to consider the six (6) criteria for Proper/Accessible Pastoral Care.

7. Viable models are based on no fewer than 1,000 persons attending weekly Mass against the 2015 October counts, and preferably between 2,000 and 4,000 weekly Mass goers, to ensure quality worship, accessibility to a priest, and enough resources to provide excellent pastoral care and evangelization. While under the guise of pastoral care, this criterion considers a larger picture. If you have say 175 people at Mass versus 350, there is a totally different feeling with the larger group. In addition, priesthood is about sacramental and pastoral service to the people; it shouldn't have to get bogged down in administration. Additional staff and people on fire for the Church and the Lord make a huge difference as well.

8. Viable models should not exceed one priest for every 2,400 persons attending weekly Mass unless a priest is required to minister to a specific community present. Perhaps this criterion was a bit funny last week. How do you divide a Priest? Well, personally I am "half a Priest"! Meaning I am part-time here and part-time in another ministry. This criterion needs to consider the next one.

9. Viable models should assume that assignments for priests include coverage of hospitals, prisons, nursing homes and other sacramental needs. In our models, we have institutions to address. There is UPMC-St. Margaret as well as the Aspinwall Veterans Affairs Health Care System. As I said, the neighboring Priests provide EMERGENCY coverage at UPMC-St. Margaret. How nice it would be to have REGULAR coverage? It would ease my burden of covering as well as give you, as a patient, the opportunity to have pastoral care in the hospital. And as the number of nursing homes increase, that's a growing need too.

10. Viable models take into consideration natural traffic patterns and topography to ensure accessibility to worship. Oh, how anti-Pittsburgh this is! We know our own world and don't dare to venture out. Though consider, you probably drive further to do shopping than you would to some of






