As you may recall, part of our pastoral plan was to have parish organizations study themselves in light of the Parish's over-all plan. Well, I have been a bit remiss in working with our organizations.



So, guess what's in YOUR future? Homework!

And while I have been remiss with the organizations, I have NOT been so with the Parish Staff. Over the last few months Tom Rishel, Bernadette Calvino, Shirley Schmitt, Gerry Ferraro, and I have been working on it. I would like to share our results with you.

We begin with our purpose statement. **The purpose of All Saints Parish Staff is to use our faith and conviction to pray and inspire so that we might show the face of Christ to those we serve.**

We have set three values for ourselves. They are as follows: **Modeling Discipleship, Kindness, and Prayer.** We defined these values in the following way. **Modeling Discipleship:** Doing the things we want others to do. **Kindness:** Showing the love of Christ to others. **Prayer:** Taking serious the need to communicate with God and asking others to do so on our behalf.

I will confess that we did have trouble setting goals for ourselves. Honestly, the real goal of the staff is to work in support of the goals of the parish. That's our jobs.

At the same time, we realize that there are things we need to attend to for the good of the parish in the next year. Let me share those. One is to establish a public parish calendar for scheduling activities. Another is to discover who actually owns the domain name www.allsaintsetna.org to see what control we might have over it. A third goal is to discover what additional information can be placed into our current parishioner census program. A fourth is to begin Men's and Women's Bible Studies in Advent. A fourth is to discern how to celebrate the Great Jubilee of Mercy for the parish. And finally, we want to start looking into planning July 2016 – June 2017!



Our recessional hymn this Sunday, “Soon and Very Soon”, gives voice to our joy in the promise of Christ’s return and the eternal life that awaits us. This song was written by Andraé Crouch, who is known as the father of modern gospel music, and was highly influential in the development of contemporary Christian music. He passed away on January 8th of this year at the age of 72.




