We welcome those who are interested in becoming Catholics. To enter a program of formation and prayer, contact the Parish Office.



Today's Gospel presents us with the familiar parable of the talents. The talent in this story is literally a type of coin, but interestingly the talent in the parable is an allegory for natural talents or abilities that God bestows upon each of us. In the parable, two of the servants were able to double the number of talents they were given while the other servant buried his talent and simply returned it back to the master. The servants who doubled their talents were rewarded while the servant who buried and returned his back was scolded and thrown into the darkness outside. God gives each of us talents and abilities and expects much back in return. He expects each of us to grow and nurture the talents we are given, and use them to help build and grow his kingdom. We must not bury our talents! We must work to discover what they are, and use them for the good of his Church and the world! Even if you think your abilities are insignificant, it is vital that you use whatever gifts you were given for good. It was the servant who was given the least who buried his talent in the parable and was punished. It is the duty of all of us to use the gifts we were given, no matter how small we think they are!

You know, Thanksgiving is this week. It is time not to stuff ourselves and our turkey; it is a great opportunity to give thanks to God for all that He has bestowed on us. For what are you most thankful? Come to Church on Thursday at 9:00 AM and tell Him about it!

Of course, Thanksgiving means early bulletin deadlines and my writing of columns. Never a favorite time of the year. However, since I pulled out the can of worms last week, might as well keep going, right? Here we go!

In last week's episode...we began discussing discipleship. Discipleship is about helping others learn about Jesus Christ. So, can you help another person be a disciple without being one yourself? No! You and I need to be disciples to be able to make disciples. I then talked about coaching or being an athlete. Both require skill and knowledge of the sport.

So, what kind of disciple are you? Expert? Mediocre? Worst one ever? This really takes honest reflection, doesn't it?

We have to not lie to ourselves by putting us where we don't belong on the spectrum of discipleship. Remember my coaching youth ministry basketball? Yea, way wrong place! When was the last time that you took an opportunity to study some aspect of the faith? Grade school? Maybe high school? Perhaps college? I'm guessing it's probably been a while for most.

As an example of discipleship, I set before you my hero, St. Ignatius of Antioch. As he was traveling to Rome to die, he wrote a number of letters. I'm thinking of his letter to the Romans. He pleads with them and I paraphrase: "Don't stop my death from happening. Let me be the wheat that is ground in the teeth of the beast to become the pure bread that is Christ." He's either nuts or a dedicated disciple. He was focused so much on Jesus Christ that he wanted others to learn from him to do the same. That's like ULTIMATE discipleship.

So, again what kind of disciple are you? What are you ready to do to help another grow as a disciple? What are the areas where you need to grow? What do you need to help you grow? And again, this is more than programing, it's a way of life. What needs to change within you to be a disciple? Are you ready to sacrifice yourself like Ignatius? Challenging questions, aren't these?


