**Prayer:** Dependence on God and Communicating with God.

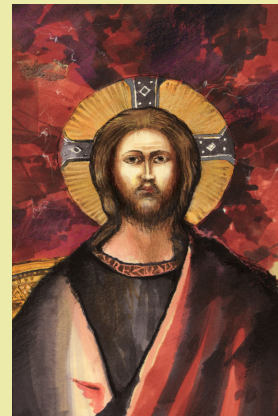
**Ministry:** Having knowledge of the faith and putting it into practice.

This week for us is all about thanksgiving. On Thursday, our country celebrates Thanksgiving Day, but today the Church

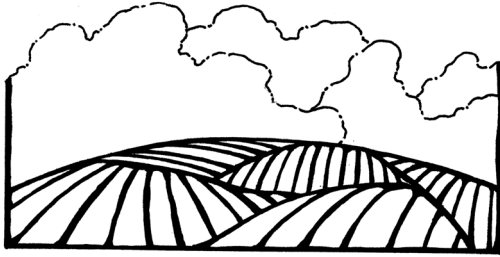
