Sometimes we get the idea that having material wealth is a bad thing. We may convince ourselves that it is the poor who are favored. In today's readings, we discover that material wealth alone does not keep us from discipleship. We will see that there are other gifts more important than material wealth, but even so, it is how we use our gifts that matters most.

Today's scriptures point to the value of the gifts of wisdom, trusting in God, and letting our actions reflect the love of God from within. It is not gold that causes us to fall, but rather the desire for gold above all other things. From the readings in Wisdom and Hebrews, we find the source of God's gifts in our lives. Wisdom is more valuable than worldly possessions. In Hebrews, we are challenged to look at our own values and admit honestly what controls our lives.

**From the Administrator's Car**

Since God is good, I should be driving home from Dallas at the moment. However, I have prepared these remarks prior to my departure.

Each fall Bishop Zubik gathers the clergy for a meeting. It is often a time to catch us up on what is most pressing in the diocese. Sadly, I come back from these meetings DEPRESSED as sometimes the news is not so good. The most recent meeting was good and bad. Let me share an overview with you.

The first part of the meeting was about our Diocesan "On Mission for the Church Alive!" planning process. You hear an intercession and the official prayer at the conclusion of the Prayer of the Faithful each Sunday. Models will be developed to best address evangelization, pastoral care, financial viability, and clergy distribution in the clusters, districts, and vicariates of the Diocese.

The second part was the distressing part, finances. During this fiscal year, 50% of our parishes will NOT be meeting their budgeted expense. This also effects the holdings of the Diocesan "Credit Union", for lack of a better term. I have teased about us filing Chapter 7 Bankruptcy. However, it is a serious issue in other parishes. Praise God we are holding our own at the moment. Please keep up your financial support!

The final part was on the current period of prayer. The evangelization steering committee has put forth three objectives. One is to increase daily Mass attendance. A second is to have social media outlets to encourage prayer during this time. The third is to develop further tools to assist individuals, families, parishes, and clusters, as well as Diocesan staff, to pray for the process. We can always do more praying.

Basically, the Diocese as a whole is doing what we did in the spring. We need to continually look at what ministry we are doing and what more could be collectively shared. This is not your "father's Church" any more! It's a new time and era. We can emerge stronger from the process.


