This is showcased in our four core values, namely:

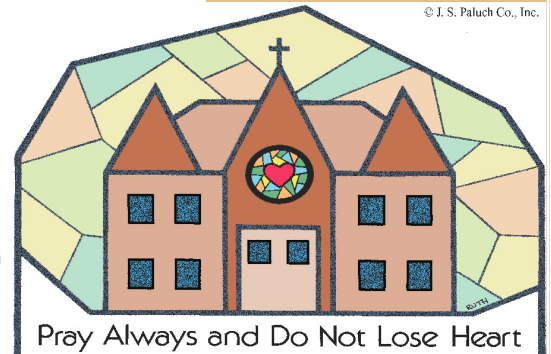
Prayer: Dependence on God and Communicating with God.

“**PIETA**” A Pro-Life Artwork by Nikki Burni. This acrylic on canvas is an original rendition of French artist William Borguereau’s “Pieta” and will enhance our sanctuary on Wednesday, October 26 for a week. Within the larger image of Mary and Jesus there are 2,492 tiny faces, representing the lives ended by abortion at Pittsburgh’s Planned Parenthood in 2014. The artist chose this image for her pro-life rendering because of the grief-stricken expression on the face of Mary. The purpose of this artwork is two-fold: **First, it is to memorialize each human life by giving them a name. Secondly, this work is meant to help us to recognize the tragedy of abortion, to realize what it has cost us, and to serve as an opportunity to grieve and to repent.** Please take time to view this artwork UP CLOSE.

BOX

The first reading for this Sunday, taken from Exodus, tells the story of a war between Israel and Amalek. Israel was only winning the war when Moses kept his hands raised up, but he grew weary and needed the support of Aaron and Hur to keep his hands raised so that Israel would be victorious. Just as Aaron and Hur supported Moses in his prayer that Israel be successful in battle, we must support the prayers of one another. In the liturgy, we support the priest as he prays on our behalf. This is why participation in the responses and singing is so very important. Prayer alone has great power, but united with the prayers of others it becomes even more powerful! When our prayers are heard and answered, we are reminded of the truth of the words of the response to today’s psalm: “Our help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.”
